My Dear Governor

We held our County Convention to-day and passed strong Liberty Resolutions 16 to 1. and appointed seven men as delegates. It was one of the best Conventions we held in the County. When you see the resolutions I want you to write me frankly what you think of them.

I now have to request you to do me a personal favor. In March I put a 60 day note in the Citizens National Bank which matures on the 23rd.
