ITALY'S GREAT WAR MACHINE GUN NOW READY. Has 1,200,000 Men Under Arms—Equipment Superior to That of the German Army.

On the Italian Frontier, via Paris, April 16—Italy today has 1,200,000 first line soldiers under arms.

General Zupelli, Italian minister of war, said today a miracle had been accomplished in Italy, which after maintaining for twenty years a military organization merely for preservation of peace had created one of the most perfect of war machines.

He said the army's equipment was superior proportionately to that of the German army at the beginning of the war.

Eager to fight. Eagerness of the soldiers along the frontier to begin action is so great that their officers are compelled to hold them closely in check.

President Frank B. Noyes, of the Association Press, and was greeted with cheers.

"I am deeply gratified by the generous reception you have accorded me," he said, "It makes me look back with a touch of regret to former occasions when I have stood in this place and enjoyed a greater liberty than has been granted me today. There have been times when I stood in this spot and said what I really thought, and I pray God that those days of indulgence may be accorded me again."

"But I have come here today, of course, somewhat restrained by a sense of responsibility that I cannot escape. Very seriously, I know the respect for that you play in the affairs of the present colossal struggle."

"It is, therefore, of very serious things that I think as I face this body of men. I do not think of you, however, as members of the Association Press. I do not think of you as men of different parties or of different religious denominations. I want to talk to you as my fellow citizens of the United States."

"For there are serious things as fellow citizens we ought to consider. The times behind us, gentlemen, have been difficult enough; the times before us are likely to be more difficult because whatever may be said about the present condition of the world's affairs, it is clear that they are drawing rapidly to a climax, and at the climax the day will come, not only of the nations, but of the present colossal struggle."

"It will come for them of course, but the test will come to us particularly."

"No Nation Can Judge Another. Do you realize that, roughly speaking, we are the only great nation which is present disengaged? I am not speaking, of course, of the disengagement of the greater of those nations in Europe which are not parties to the present war but I am thinking of their close neighbor."

RAILROADS APPEAL TO PRESIDENT

The Common Carriers Ask for Relief—President Wilson Directs Attention of Public to Their Needs.

The committee of railroad executives, headed by Mr. Frank Trumbull, representing thirty-five of the leading railroad systems of the nation, recently presented to President Wilson a memorandum briefly reviewing the difficulties now confronting the railroads of the country and asking for the cooperation of the governmental authorities and the public in supporting railroad credits and recognizing an emergency which requires that the railroads be given additional revenues.

The memorandum recites that the European war has resulted in general depression of business on the American continent, and the consequent reduction of credits at home and abroad. With revenues decreasing and interest rates increasing the transportation systems of the country face a most serious crisis and the memorandum in a strong presentation of the conditions which must ultimately attend such a catastrophe when the flames meet is apparent to all. In their general discussion the railroad representatives say in part: "By reason of legislation and regulation by the federal government and the forty-eight states acting independently of each other, as well as through the action of a strong public opinion, railroad expenses in recent years have vastly increased. No criticism is here made of the general theory of governmental legislation, but on the other hand, no indignantly can release the carriers of expense created thereby."

President Wilson, in transmitting the memorandum of the railroad presidents to the public, characterized it as "a most interesting and important study." The president, recognizing the emergency as extraordinary, continuing, said in part:

You ask me to call the attention of the country to the important need that railway credits be sustained and the railroads helped in every possible way, whether by private cooperative effort or by the action, whenever feasible of governmental agencies, and I am glad to do so because I think the need very real."

The conference was certainly a fortunate one for the nation and the president is to be congratulated for opening the gate to a new world of effort in which everyone may cooperate.

There are many important problems in our complex civilization that will lend themselves to arbitrary rulings of commissions and managing railroads is one of them. The main with the economy is a factor that cannot be eliminated from any business transaction and the public is an interested party that should always be consulted and happily the president has invited all to participate in the solution of our railroad problems.

The Old and the New. Inventions have a remarkable knack of repeating themselves. Among the more interesting patents for 1915 is a specification for a wheelless motor car, propulsion being by means of fluids, which are alternately lowered and raised. In the early days of locomotive history many inventors did not believe that sufficient adhesion was to be attained by a smooth wheel operating on a smooth rail, and weird contrivances were devised for overcoming this supposed defect. One ingenious engineer went so far as to design a contrivance in which jointed metal bars worked up and down on the rails at the flange of a horse's legs, and there seems to be a certain similarity between this device and the motor car referred to above.
