June 24<sup>th</sup> 1861

My Dear Sir

Your note has been received. There are six rooms in your present quarters two above & four below. I had supposed that ~~the~~ in a case like the present the back room on the lower floor could be used & that your patients with the stretch could be confined to the two rooms up stairs. If this is not so, I will provide an excellent house immediately for hospital purposes and you may have private Boarding conveyed to that place.

I will make requisitions upon the proper Departments at New Bern for such hospital stores as you need. When furnished with a list & called on to do so. This I believe I professed to do two weeks since.
