Sir -

I send in charge of Sergeant William M. Stevenson the captain, mate & crew of the Schooner ~~Katharine~~ Chase of Harwich Mass: taken yesterday off this Inlet, by the Privateer Steamer *Mariner*, Captain Berry. These men were put into my custody by the Capt of the Privateer. Their names are as follows.
