## Pirates, unbeaten Ragin' Cajuns renew rivalry this afternoon

East Carolina, coming off a heart-breaking 45-42 loss last week to Southern Mississippi, faces a strong, undefeated Southwestern Louisiana team today at Ficklen Stadium.

Last week, the Pirates led Southern Miss 42-38 with just 1:32 remaining after reserve quarterback Charlie Libretto hit Al Whiting with a 20-yard touchdown strike in the endzone. The Pirates appeared to have their second win of the season in hand.

Southern Miss, however, had other thoughts.

On fourth and two from near midfield, Golden Eagle sophomore quarterback Brett Favre hit Eddie Ray Jackson for a nine-yard completion and a first down. One play later, Favre found receiver Alfred Williams open along the sideline for a critical 42-yard gain to the ECU five yard line.

USM reserve quarterback Ailrick Young, two plays later, hit Preston Hansford in the endzone for the game-winner.

A total of 1,130 yards total offense were produced by both teams in this wild contest, the most yardage ever in a game involving ECU.

"I'm proud of our players. They came back from a difficult situation," ECU head coach Art Baker said after the Pirates' third straight loss. "We made some mistakes on defense and they made some great plays.

"My job is to coach and not let the players' heads stay down. We'll have to play much better on both sides of the ball against a team like Southwestern Louisiana."

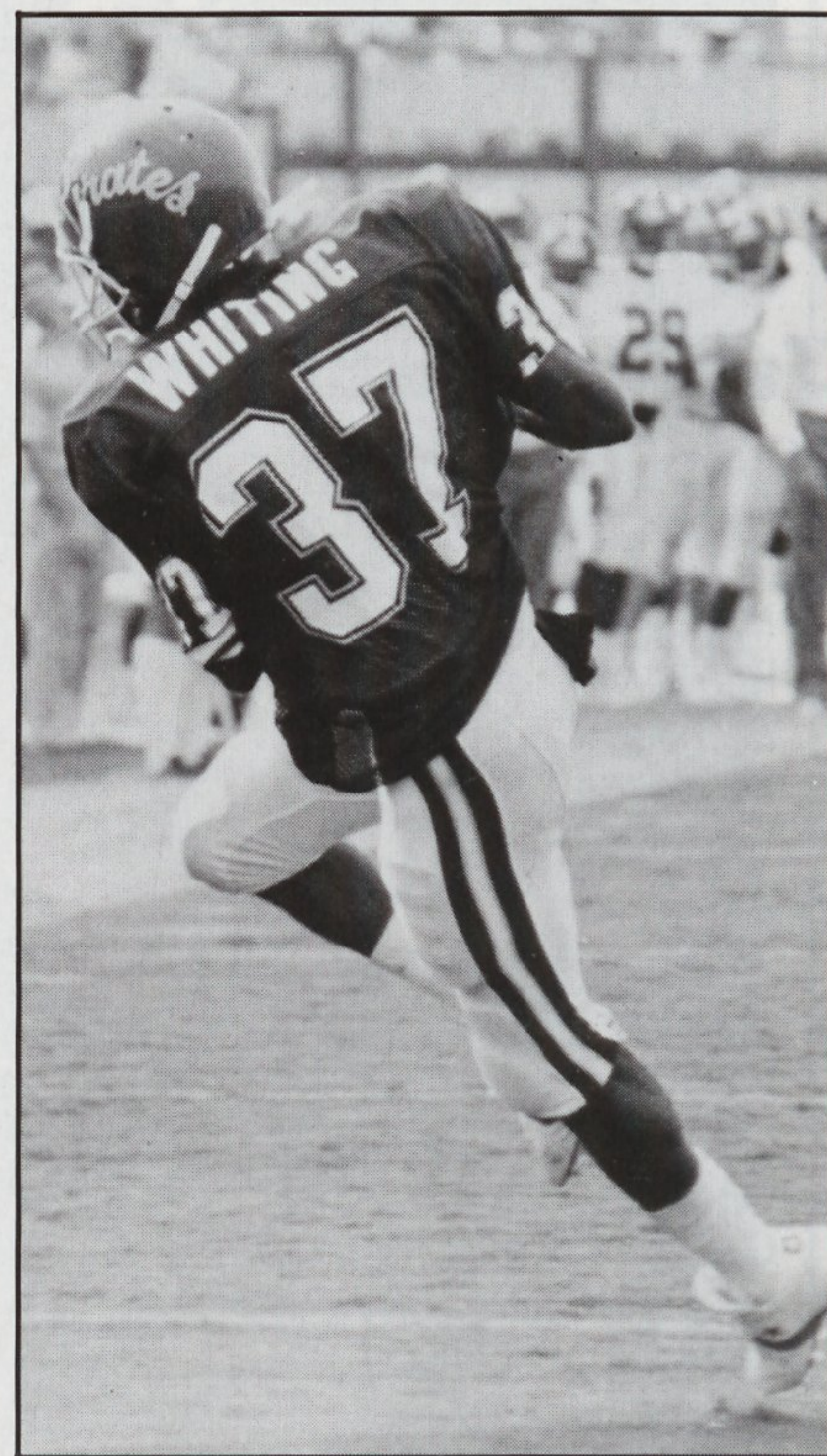
The unbeaten Ragin' Cajuns improved to 3-0 last week by whipping Rice of the Southwestern Conference, 41-17 in Lafayette, LA.

After trailing Rice 9-6 in the second quarter, USL broke the game open with 21 points in the final 6:26 of the quarter for a comfortable 30-9 halftime lead. The Cajuns held on in the second half for their fifth straight win (dating back to last season)

in front of 24,800 fans — the largest USL home crowd in four years.

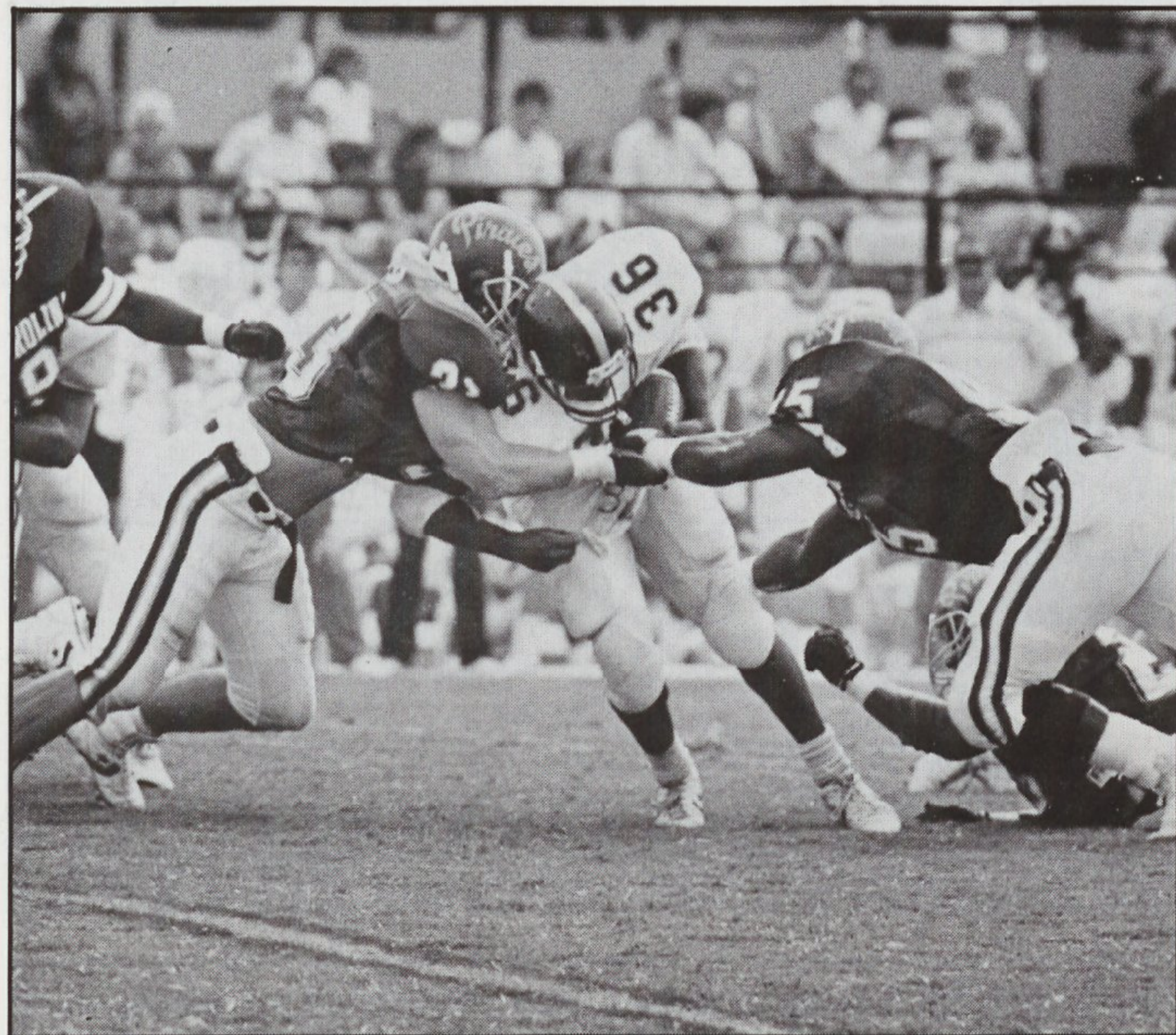
If last week was any indication, today's game has the potential to be a high-scoring affair. Both ECU and USL employ the Run and Shoot offense and are averaging just under 28 and 33 points respectively per game.

The Cajun offense is directed

by versatile quarterback Brian Mitchell, who last week tied a school record by rushing for four touchdowns. In his last eight games, the sophomore signal caller has scored 15 TDs.

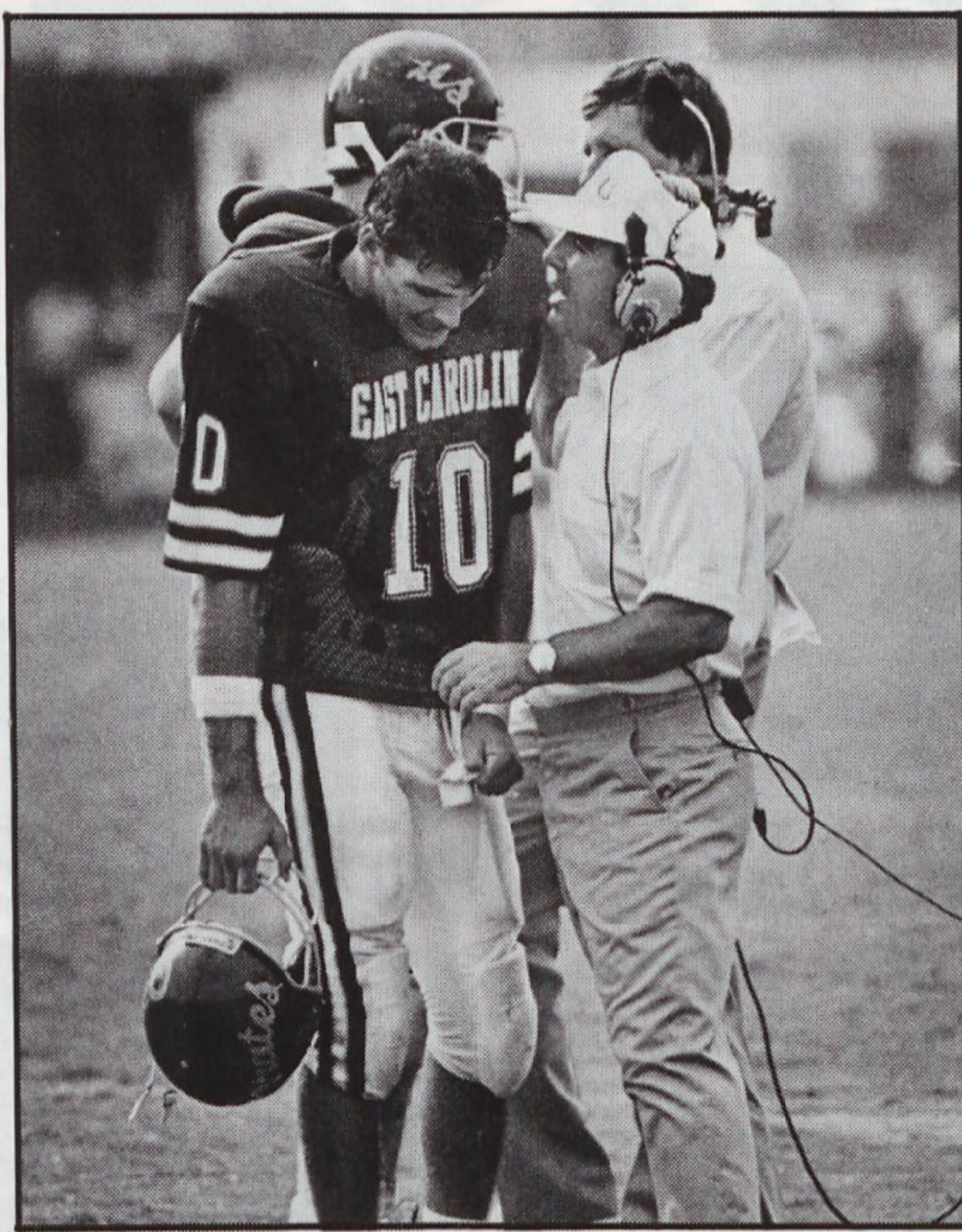
USL's strongpoint, however, may be on the defensive side of the ball, where 28 lettermen return from last year's 6-5 team. Three members of that defensive unit — linemen Chris Gannon and Mark Hall and safety Thomas King — are projected to be selected in the first four rounds of the NFL draft next year.

*The Sporting News* called Gannon the second-best defensive end in the country earlier this year, and Hall is a second team all-America pre-season selection.

Southwestern, under the direction of head coach Nelson Stokley, is off to its best start since 1982. The five-game win streak is the longest the school has enjoyed in 11 years.

"No doubt about it, Southwestern Louisiana is a very good football team," Baker said. "They may be the most

underrated team on our schedule.

"Their offense can put the points on the board and their defense has really impressed us."

East Carolina, in the middle of a three-game homestand, looks to get back on the winning track today as it enters arguably the most difficult October schedule in the nation.

After today's game, the Pirates bump heads with four teams that played in bowl games last year. Next week, ECU

hosts 8th-ranked West Virginia for Homecoming. Later this month the Pirates must visit Florida State, then return home for consecutive games against Syracuse and Miami.

After making it through pre-season drills and the season opener against Tennessee Tech relatively unscathed, the Pirates now see their list of injuries growing. Senior fullback Tim James played just part of the first quarter against Southern Miss, before going out with a

bruised foot. Junior linebacker James Singletary has missed the last two games with a bruised thigh and senior tailback Reggie McKinney is nursing a sore wrist.

Also injured last week were cornerback Junior Robinson and linebacker Anthony Thompson. Jarrod Moody, who injured his thigh against Tennessee Tech, has played in all four ECU games, but has not yet reached full strength.

All injured players, however, are expected to play today against Southwestern Louisiana.

Southwestern Louisiana leads the series 5-3 dating back to 1977. The two teams met last in 1986 here at Ficklen Stadium, with USL overcoming a halftime deficit to win 21-10.

USL is the only unbeaten team remaining in the state of Louisiana after previously undefeated LSU lost at Ohio State last week. The Pirates hope to use the friendly confines of Ficklen Stadium to their advantage today as the Cajuns will be playing their first road game. USL finished 1-5 in six road games last year.

"We are in the position where every game from now on is key for us," Baker said. "But this game is very important. The last two weeks we have found ways to lose at the end of the game and now we must find a way to win."

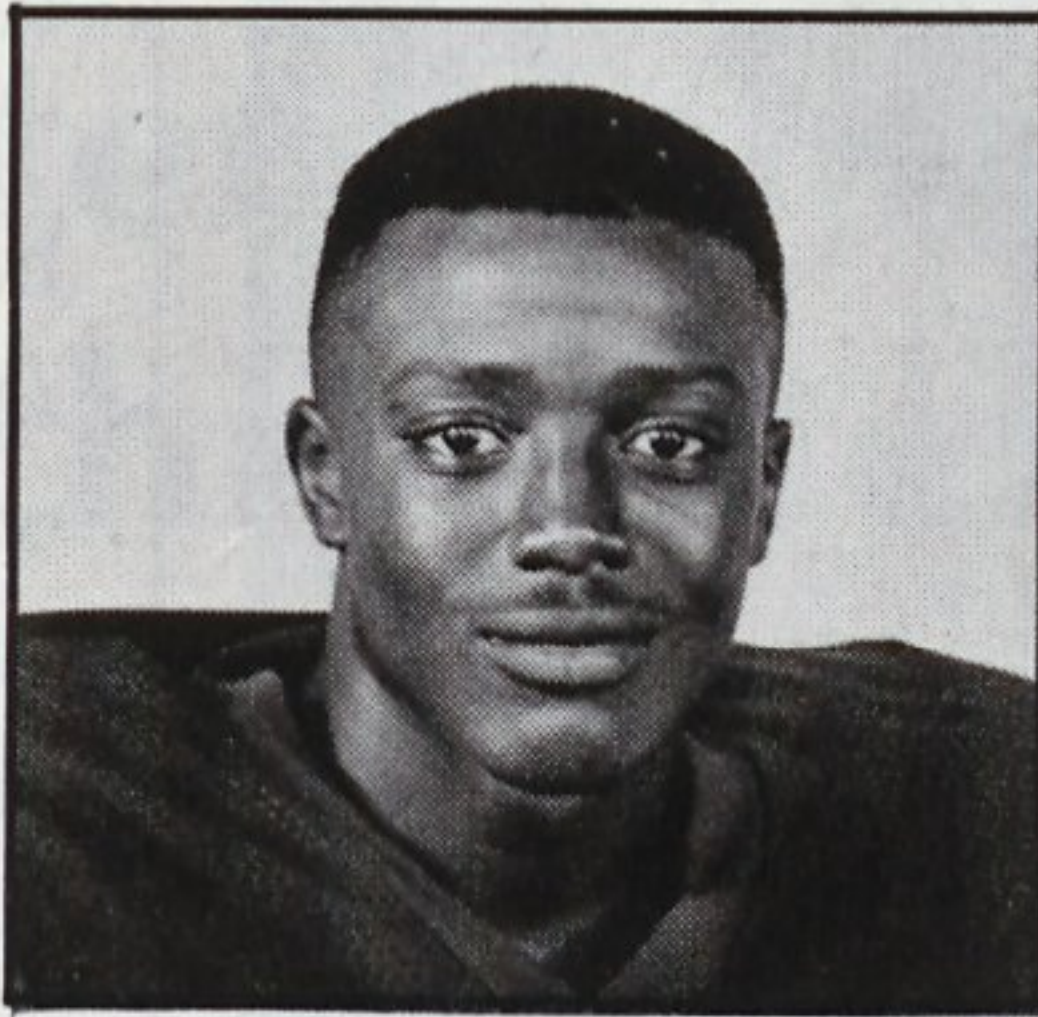

# Chancellor Dr. Richard Eakin

Dr. Richard R. Eakin became ECU's ninth chief executive officer on March 1, 1987, succeeding the retiring Chancellor John M. Howell.



**EAKIN**

Eakin, a New Castle, Pennsylvania, native, was previously vice president for planning and budgeting at Bowling Green State University, Ohio. He had been at Bowling Green since 1964, first as an assistant, then associate, professor of mathematics and statistics, before serving in a succession of administrative positions. He became a Bowling Green vice president in 1983.

Joining Eakin in Greenville is his wife, the former Jo Ann McGeehan. The couple are the parents of two children, Matthew, 22, and Maridy, 20.

The new chancellor is an alumnus of Geneva College, where he received his BA degree in mathematics and physics "summa cum laude" in 1960. He held three four-year scholarships at Geneva, including a Wolves Club academic scholarship and a basketball scholarship. He received M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in mathematics from Washington State.

Dr. Eakin has participated in the Institute for Educational Management at

Harvard University and in an institute for student personnel officers sponsored by the American Council on Education. He has delivered papers at major national gatherings of education administrators and served on various committees for the Ohio Board of Regents.

His community service has included a term as chairman of the board of directors and vice president for administration and finance for the National Hemophilia Foundation. In

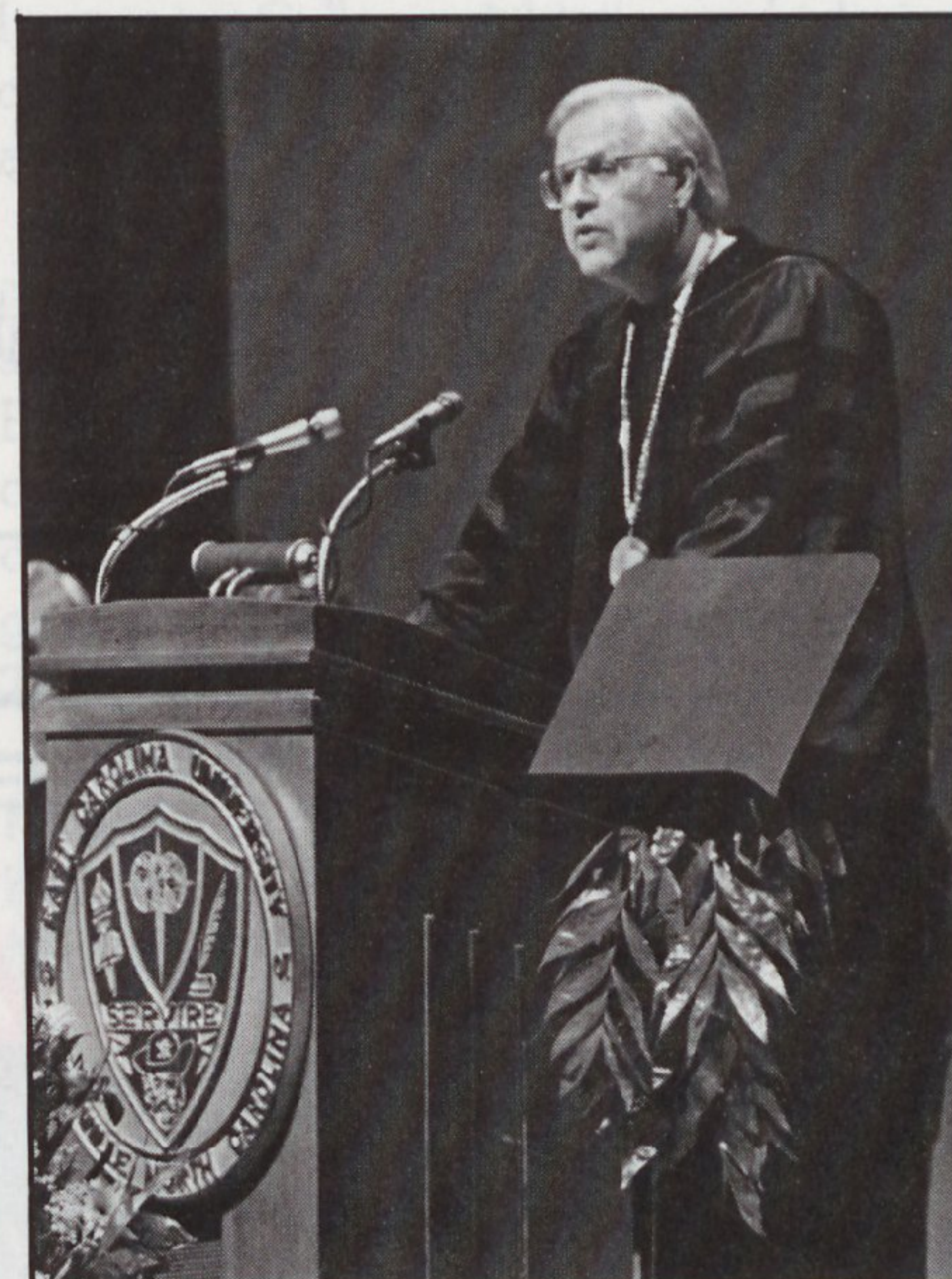

addition, he has been active in the Presbyterian Church as a deacon and elder and is a former chairman of the Wood County, Ohio Community Mental Health Board.

Eakin's appointment to the ECU chancellorship was the culmination of a nationwide search conducted by a committee of trustees, faculty and student leaders, and recommendation by UNC system President C.D. Spangler, Jr. A total of 125 candidates were considered for the position.

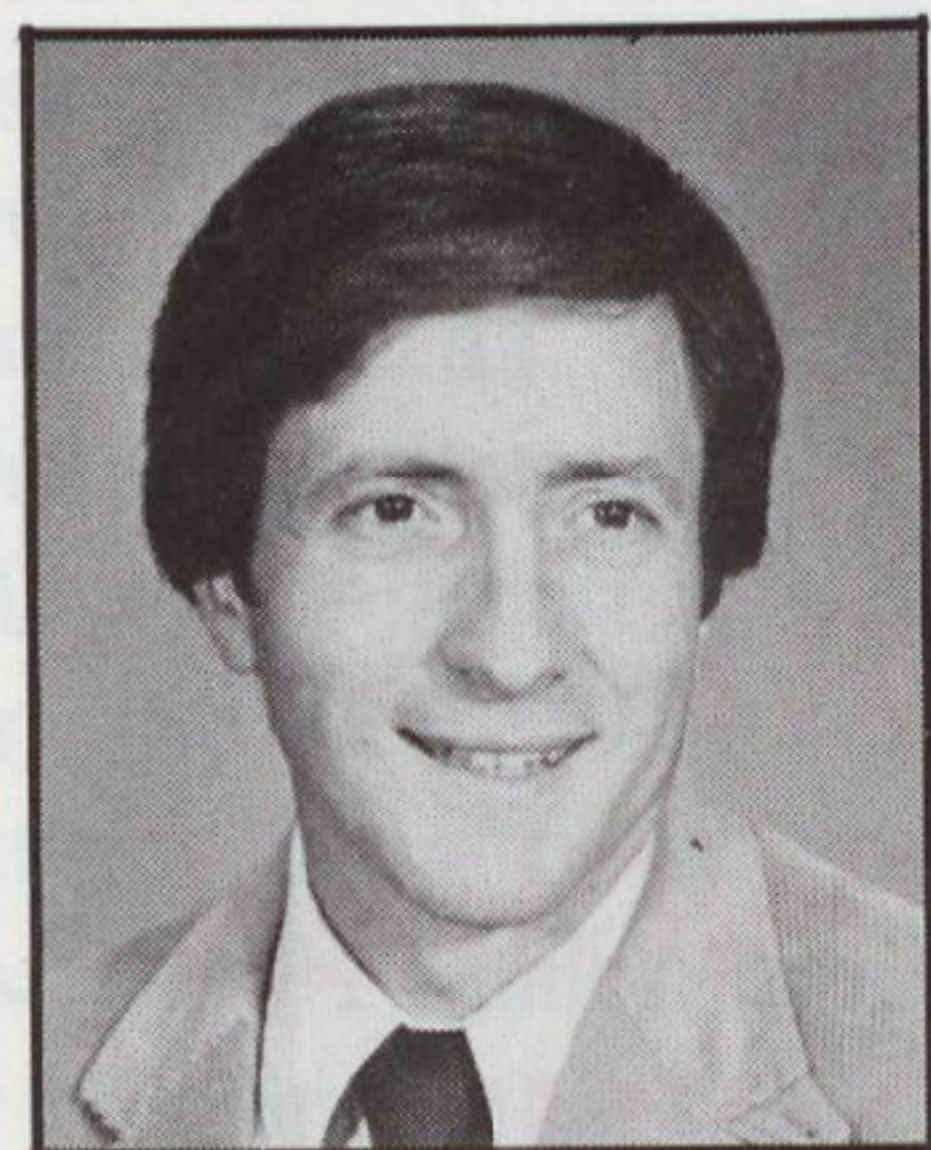

# Director of Athletics Dave Hart, Jr.

**D**irector of Athletics:

Administrator, coach, community leader, family man. Energetic, enthusiastic, compassionate, vibrant, innovative, personable.



**HART**

All apply to Dave Hart before and since his arrival at East Carolina.

Hart became only the fifth athletic director to serve East Carolina on Dec. 21, 1987. He followed Dr. Ken Karr, who resigned after leading the Pirate athletic program since 1980.

Hart first joined the ECU athletic department in 1983 as an assistant athletic director for marketing. It was the first time that ECU had ever employed a full-time staff member for marketing, and it immediately brought dividends.

ECU's marketing program gained national attention for the rapid growth in crowd participation through tailgating and other promotional efforts. Hart was also responsible for implementing the "Great Pirate Purple-Gold Pigskin Pig-Out Party," which is a weekend extravaganza surrounding the spring football game.

Additionally, attendance at home football games increased greatly as evidenced by the fact that nine of the top 12 crowds in Ficklen Stadium history have entered the turnstiles since the 1983 season. Promotional ventures such as the "Ain't It Great To Tailgate" idea have added to the atmosphere at Pirate home games.

Hart was named associate director of athletics for external relations and executive director of the Pirate Club in 1985. His expanded duties included the raising of funds for athletic scholarships through the Pirate Club, as well as overseeing all external areas of the athletic department.

During his first two years in that position, the Pirate Club experienced record-setting growth as it surpassed the coveted \$1 million mark in contributions for the first time ever. The 1987 campaign saw another record performance under his direction as the Club exceeded

the \$1.2 million level.

Hart has become a popular speaker at the national level and has authored articles for a number of national publications in the areas of marketing, promotions and fund-raising. He has made numerous speaking presentations at NCAA conventions and seminars, and during the past four NACDA (National

Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics) conventions, has served as an instructor at the Management Institute.

Upon the announcement of his new appointment as athletic director, ECU Chancellor Richard Eakin made these remarks in introducing Hart.

"Dave has served the University with

distinction since April 1983," Dr. Eakin said. "He has successfully led private fund-raising efforts to record levels with gift income in excess of \$1 million and donor participation exceeding 4,300.

"Dave has an exceptional understanding of all aspects of athletic administration, has a strong commitment to excellence and integrity throughout the men's and women's programs, and possesses, in my judgement, the leadership qualities necessary to continue to develop our athletic program and move it to new levels of achievement."

Just one month into his new position, Hart was appointed to the NCAA's prestigious Committee on Integrity and Image in College Athletics, which is chaired by Georgia Tech director of athletics Homer Rice.

Hart received his undergraduate and graduate degrees from the University of Alabama, earning a B.S. in English/Speech in 1971 and a master's degree in 1972. He attended Alabama on a basketball scholarship and was a graduate assistant coach for the Crimson Tide program in 1972.

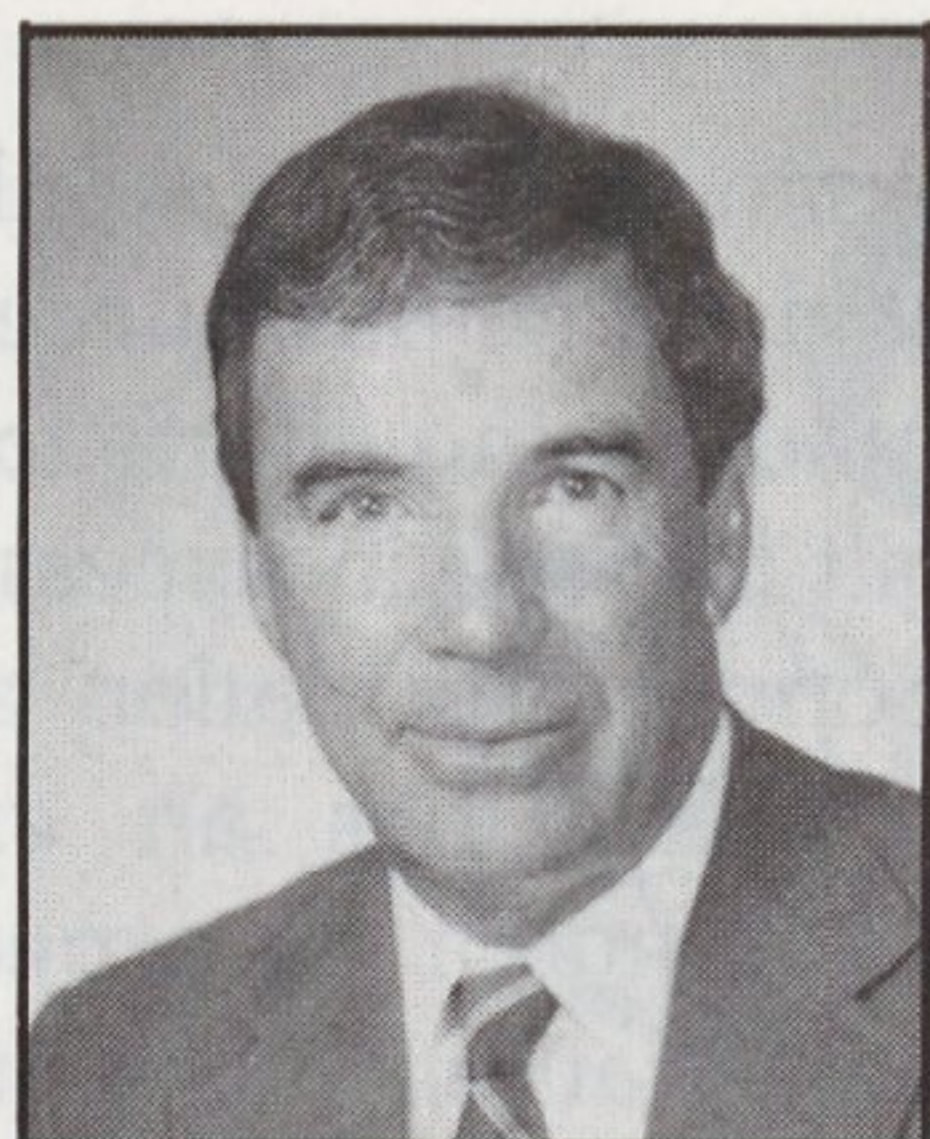
He is married to the former Pam Humble of Tuscaloosa, AL and they have three children—Ricky (16), Jamie Michelle (14) and Kelly Ann (11).

# Head Coach Art Baker

Art Baker, one of the most respected coaches on the collegiate level, begins his fourth season as head coach of the East Carolina University program.



BAKER

Baker became the Pirate head coach prior to the 1985 season as he came to ECU after serving as assistant head coach at Florida State during the 1984 season. Prior to his tenure with the Seminoles, Baker was the associate head coach here at ECU during the Pirates' fine 8-3 campaign in 1983.

Following two 2-9 seasons in 1985 and 1986 that saw the Pirates take on some of the toughest competition in the nation, Baker and his staff began to turn the corner last season as ECU posted a 5-6 record. That feat was made more impressive by the fact that the Pirates faced the nation's number one (Miami), two (Florida State), and 15th-ranked (South Carolina) teams.

ECU has faced the past two national champions (the Pirates played Penn State in 1986) and Baker's teams have competed against two Heisman Trophy winners (Auburn's Bo Jackson and Miami's Vinny Testaverde) in his first three seasons at the Pirate helm.

With 27 years of intercollegiate coaching experience, Baker owns a career head coaching record of 66-72-5 in 13 years. Stops include Southern Conference entries Furman (1973-77) and The Citadel (1978-82) prior to ECU. Baker left both Furman and The Citadel with a winning record during his tenure.

The Sumter, SC, native is considered one of college football's top offensive minds. He spent 1984 directing Florida State's high-powered offense as he was responsible for play calling and tutoring FSU's quarterbacks. He also was directly responsible for revitalizing the Seminole running game as FSU averaged 274.6 yards a game on the ground, the fifth best average in the nation and the

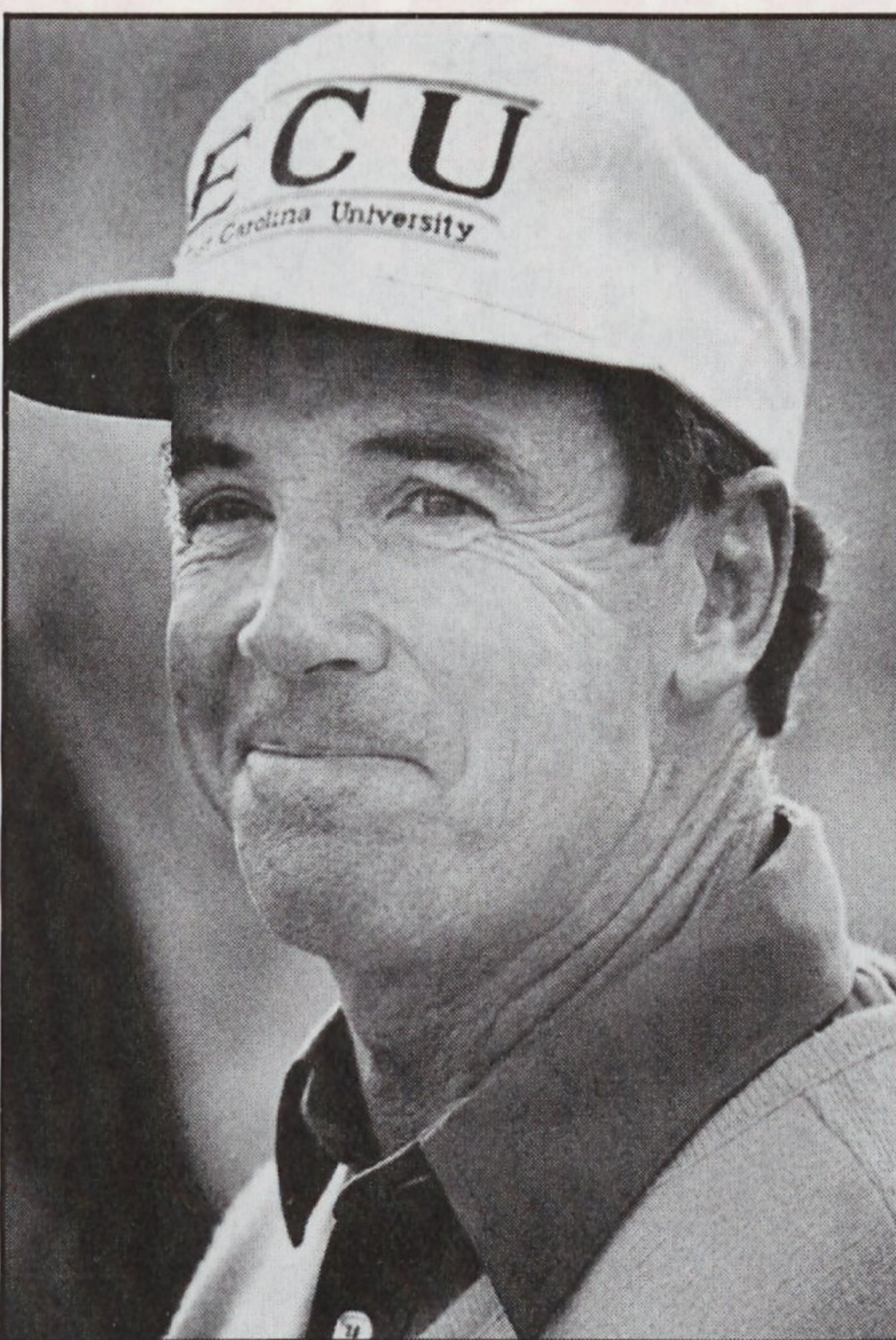
highest in Florida State history.

It was the option under Baker in 1983 that helped lead ECU to one of its finest seasons ever. The Pirates' "Freeze Option" offense, with Baker calling the plays, ranked 16th in the nation in rushing offense (239.4 yards per game).

Before coming to ECU, Baker coached The Citadel in Charleston, SC, for five seasons, compiling a 30-24-1 mark for a .555 winning percentage, second best in the school's history. At Furman, where Baker was head coach from 1973-77, he guided the Paladins to a 27-24-4 record and shared Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors during the 1973 season. That season also saw Baker named Churchman's Coach of the Year.

The 1953 graduate of Presbyterian College (Clinton, SC) began his coaching career in the South Carolina high school ranks as he was head coach at Eastern McColl (two years), Newberry (two years) and North Columbia's Eau Claire (six years), compiling an impressive 62-37-8 record.

In 1965 Baker went to Clemson to

become the head freshman coach. That season saw Clemson's freshmen post a 4-0-1 record and from 1966 through 1969 Baker coached the varsity offensive backfield. In 1970 he moved to Texas Tech of the Southwest Conference as offensive backfield coach, where he remained until becoming head coach at Furman in 1973. The Red Raiders made Sun Bowl appearances twice (1970 and 1972) during Baker's three seasons at the Lubbock, TX school.

## Sports Medicine / Physical Education Building

The first major step in East Carolina's continuing efforts to upgrade facilities, the Sports Medicine/Physical Education Building, becomes a reality in the spring of 1989.

The three-story, 82,095-square foot structure is scheduled for completion in late April. The future home of ECU's athletic department, the Sports Medicine/Physical Education Building will provide the two areas with state-of-the-art technology.

"From a facilities standpoint, the new building will take us to another level," ECU director of athletics Dave Hart said. "The building is a very visible illustration of the direction our program is headed.

"While it is a source of pride for the physical education and sports medicine departments, it is a great source of pride for our athletic department."

The injury treatment and rehabilitation center of the sports medicine department will include the latest in technology, making it one of the top sports medicine programs in the country. Among the many features of the new building is a 5,000-square foot strength training center, a state-of-the-art human performance laboratory, bio-mechanics lab, classrooms and men's and women's locker rooms.

The entire coaching staffs for the football and men's and women's basketball

teams will be housed on the second floor, while the entire athletic administrative staff will find their offices on the top level.

"The building will be top-notch," ECU director of sports medicine Rod Compton said. "It will put us on the cutting edge of facilities and technology in the country.

"It's a visual demonstration of the close relationship here at ECU between athletics and academics."

The building will be unique in structure. The shortest of six sides of the building will be the front of the facility and face 35,000-seat Ficklen Stadium.

The first floor will connect with Minges Coliseum via a covered walkway. Features of the first floor include:

**\*Football** – Offices for the head coach, nine assistant coaches, graduate assistants, a recruiting coordinator and secretaries. Football will also have two storage rooms, a file room, and have access to two mini-auditoriums.

**\*Sports Medicine Training Center** – Sophisticated injury treatment, evaluation and rehabilitation equipment will fill the room including touch-control whirlpools, a computerized isokinetic rehabilitation and evaluation machine, exam rooms including one dental chair, and a 7-foot deep whirlpool that will allow an injured athlete to exercise without bearing weight.

**\*Strength Training Center** – Will include 5,000-square feet of shiny new chrome and steel, with mirror-lined walls.

**\*Locker Rooms** – Both men and women.

**\*Equipment Storage** – A spacious area with equipment for 135 football players and more.

Attractions of the second floor include:

**\*Letterman's Lounge** – A perfect "recruiting room" that will overlook Ficklen Stadium. Trophy cases, retired jerseys and mementos from Pirate athletes now in the pros will line the room.

**\*Basketball** – More offices for each coach, and a meeting room for both the men's and women's staff.

**\*Academic Counseling** – Computers and tutors are available to keep the student-athlete ahead in his studies.

**\*Classrooms**

**\*Sports Medicine Offices**

The top floor will include:

**\*Human Performance Laboratory** – A sophisticated lab with the latest in human performance technology.

**\*Biomechanics Lab**

**\*Athletic Administrative Staff** – Offices will saturate the third floor from the athletic director to the business manager to the sports information director.

When completed, the Sports Medicine/Physical Education Building will be a unique structure, unlike any facility in the country.

"With the athletic department and portions of the physical education department under one roof," said Hart, "the building is a positive illustration of how athletics and academics go hand-in-hand here at East Carolina."

# Stadium Information



## Ficklen Stadium Rules & Regulations for 1988 Season

### FOR ALL STADIUM EMPLOYEES

1. NO STADIUM EMPLOYEE IS PERMITTED TO ACCEPT TICKETS TO SELL OR EXCHANGE.
2. ANY STADIUM EMPLOYEE WHO PERMITS ANYONE TO ENTER STADIUM WITHOUT AN AUTHORIZED TICKET OR PROPER CREDENTIALS WILL BE DISMISSED IMMEDIATELY.
3. Any problems regarding tickets or entry to Ficklen Stadium should be referred to the ticket office windows in front of Minges Coliseum.
4. EMPLOYEES FOUND AWAY FROM THEIR STATIONS OR VIOLATING ANY OF THE INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN THEM MAY BE DISCHARGED IMMEDIATELY AND FORFEIT FUTURE EMPLOYMENT.
5. Employees are asked to refrain from smoking while on duty, especially while taking tickets, checking tickets, or when in close contact with customers.
6. Employees MUST BE COURTEOUS AT ALL TIMES.

### PERSONNEL ASSIGNED IN THE STANDS

1. Persons in charge of aisles will see that no one enters an aisle who does not have a reserved ticket calling for a seat in that section.
2. TICKETS SHOULD BE CHECKED BEFORE AND DURING THE GAME AND BETWEEN HALVES.
3. Any difficulty that cannot be satisfactorily settled by the Aisle Superintendent should be reported to the person in charge of your half of the stands.
4. Disorderly conduct must be reported immediately to nearest officer in uniform.
5. Aisle Superintendents are charged with preventing anyone from entering. AISLES AND PORTALS MUST BE KEPT OPEN.
6. A special effort will be made by all Aisle Superintendents to keep people from standing and crowding at top of the aisles. Please move fans to their seats as quickly as possible.

### First Aid:

The First Aid facility is located under the North stands behind Section 29 with a nurse on duty at all times. Rescue Squad units are located at both ends of the field.

### Lost & Found:

Contact a security officer located at the base of the press elevator under the South stands. After the game, contact East Carolina University Security Department.

### Rest Rooms:

Rest rooms are located under the North and South stands and can be reached by exit from any portal.

### Public Telephones:

A telephone for public use is located under the South stands, directly opposite the press elevator.

### Requests for Assistance:

Requests for assistance should be directed to stadium ushers, located at every ramp throughout the stadium for your convenience.

### Field Regulations:

No one is allowed on the playing field during or after the game without the proper approval granted before the game. Stadium ramps must be used for exit. Fans may be ejected for throwing any objects in the stadium.

### Alcoholic Beverages:

Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited within the stadium.

### Banners:

Banners hung in Ficklen Stadium must be approved by Henry VanSant, Associate Athletic Director (919) 757-6417 by 5 p.m. Wednesday prior to the day of the game.

### Handicapped Access:

An entrance for the handicapped is located at the gate entrance at the Southeast corner of the stadium near Section 12, with a seating section available in the South stands at field level directly in front of the Press Box.

### Concession Stands:

Concession stands are located beneath the North and South stands and vendors will be going throughout the stadium.

# Noting The Pirates

## Series History

Southwestern Louisiana leads the series with ECU, 5-3. In games played in Greenville, USL leads 3-1. In games played in Lafayette, the series is tied, 2-2. The series began on Oct. 29, 1977 in Greenville with USL taking a 9-7 win. The last meeting was Oct. 4, 1986 in Greenville, with USL winning 21-10. Five of the eight games have been decided by less than a touchdown. USL has won the last three contests with ECU's last win coming Oct. 8, 1983 in Greenville (21-18). Art Baker was an assistant at ECU that season.

## Coaching Ties

USL outside linebacker coach Steve Hale was a four-year letterman as free safety for East Carolina during the 1974-77 seasons.

Both ECU coach Art Baker and USL coach Nelson Stokley served at one time as assistants at Clemson. Baker served as a freshman coach and offensive backfield coach at Clemson from 1965-69. Stokley was the offensive coordinator at Clemson from 1980-85.

USL assistant Rex Kipps was also an assistant at ECU.

## Baker Against USL

ECU head coach Art Baker is 1-3 against the Ragin' Cajuns. As head coach at Furman in 1976, his squad went to Lafayette and lost, 27-16. In 1983, as an assistant at ECU, the Pirates won 21-18. And, in 1985 and 1986, as head coach at ECU, the Cajuns won 16-14 and 21-10.

## McKinney Oh, So Close To 1,000

With 11 yards rushing against Southern Mississippi, senior tailback Reggie McKinney needs just **one yard** against USL to have 1,000 career rushing yards. In his ECU career, McKinney has 999 yards on 179 carries, a 5.58 yard per carry average. He is also a threat on special teams, averaging 25.9 yards per kickoff return. For the first time this season, he did not return a kick over 40 yards.

## Perfect Strangers – Week 2

Again this week, there are no players on the ECU squad from the state of the week's opponent — Louisiana. And, there are no USL players on the squad from the state of North Carolina.

## Last Meeting

On October 4, 1986 in Greenville, N.C., Southwestern Louisiana defeated East Carolina, 21-10. After both teams did not score in the first quarter, USL's Pat Broussard kicked field goals of 39 and 21 yards to give the Cajuns a 6-0 lead. ECU's Anthony Simpson then scored on a 16-yard run later in the second quarter to give the Pirates a 7-6 halftime lead. USL came out in the second half and played tough defense in allowing the Pirates just a late field goal in beating ECU, 21-10. Quarterback Richard Pannell hit Willie Culpepper with a 47-yard TD pass and fullback Felton Parquet scored from one-yard out for the remaining USL score.

## The Formations

Both USL and East Carolina use the "Run-and-Shoot" offense while ECU employs the "60" defense and USL has the "Eight-man Front" defensive alignment.

## Experienced Cajuns

USL is the most experienced defensive squad on the East Carolina schedule with 28 returning lettermen. Florida State and Southern Miss each had 22 to return on defense.

## ECU vs. Louisiana

East Carolina is 5-9 against teams from the state of Louisiana. The Pirates are 0-1 against LSU, 1-2 against Louisiana Tech, 1-1 against Northeast Louisiana and 3-5 against Southwestern Louisiana.

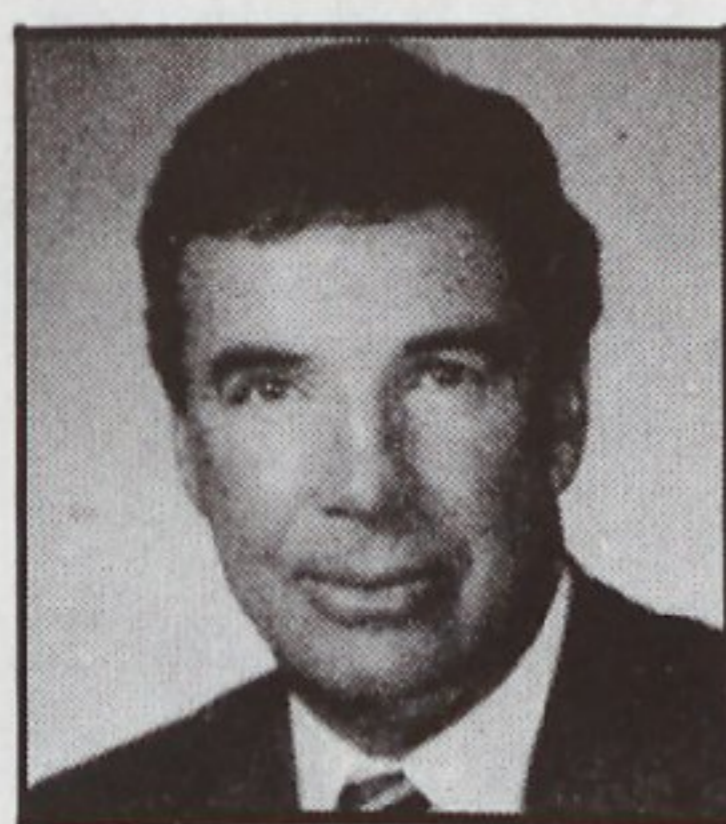

## Libretto Gets Up For USM

ECU reserve quarterback Charlie Libretto would probably like to play Southern Mississippi each week. The Middleburg, Fla., native has completed 20 of 37 passes for 386 yards and five touchdowns in the three games he has played against USM. In 192 other pass attempts, he has thrown two touchdown passes.

## Several Records Broken vs. USM

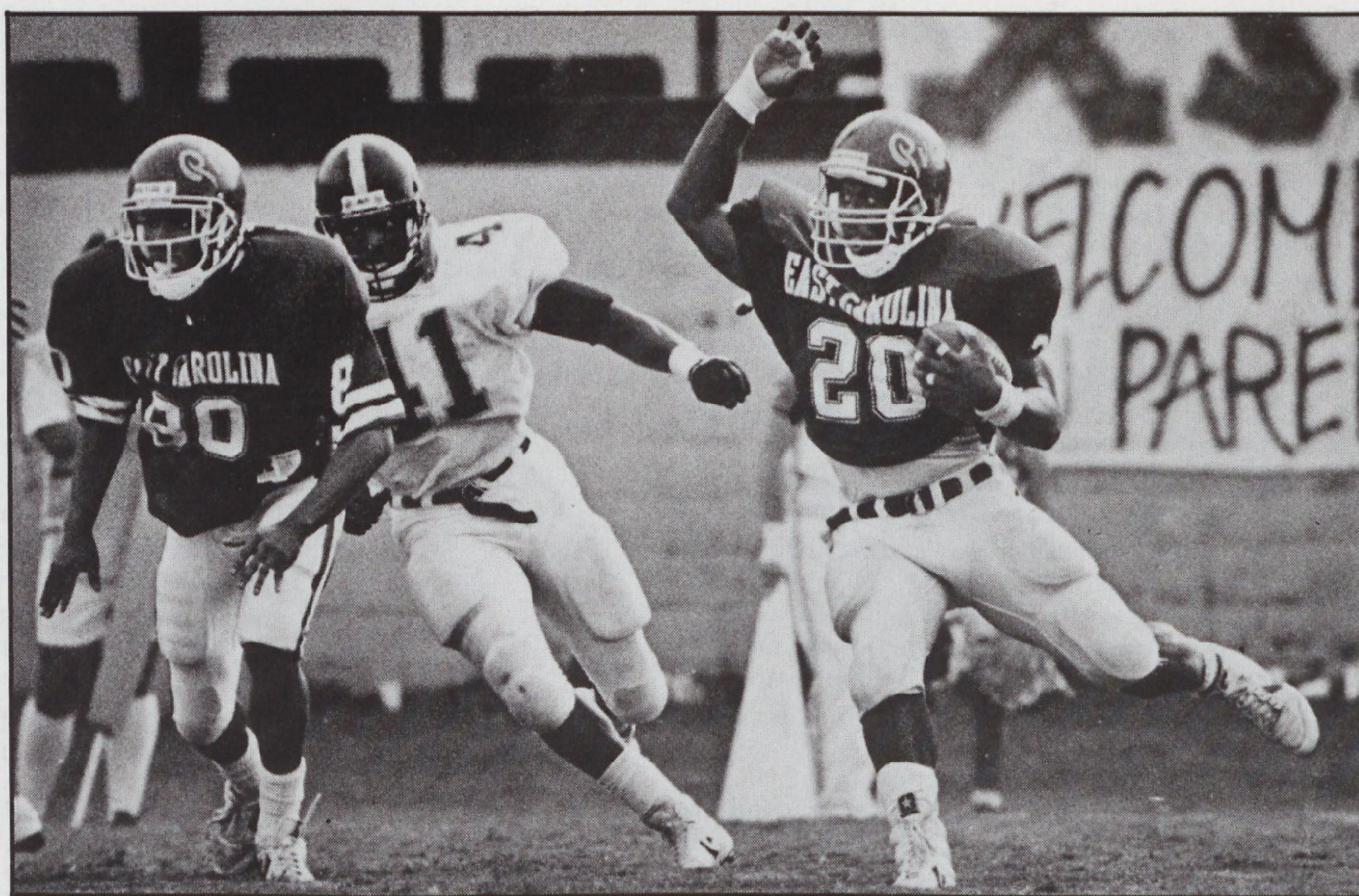
Several records were broken last Saturday against Southern Miss. Charlie Libretto threw an 84-yard TD pass to Reggie McKinney that was the longest in ECU history. The record of 83 yards, Carl Summerell to Tim Dameron, stood for 16 years. Also, both USM and ECU combined for 1,130 yards of total offense — a Ficklen Stadium record. That eclipsed the record of 1,100 set by Virginia and ECU on Nov. 8, 1975. The four touchdown passes by the Pirates tied a school mark set in 1962 against Newberry and 1953 against Appalachian State.

# R.W. Moore Scholarship

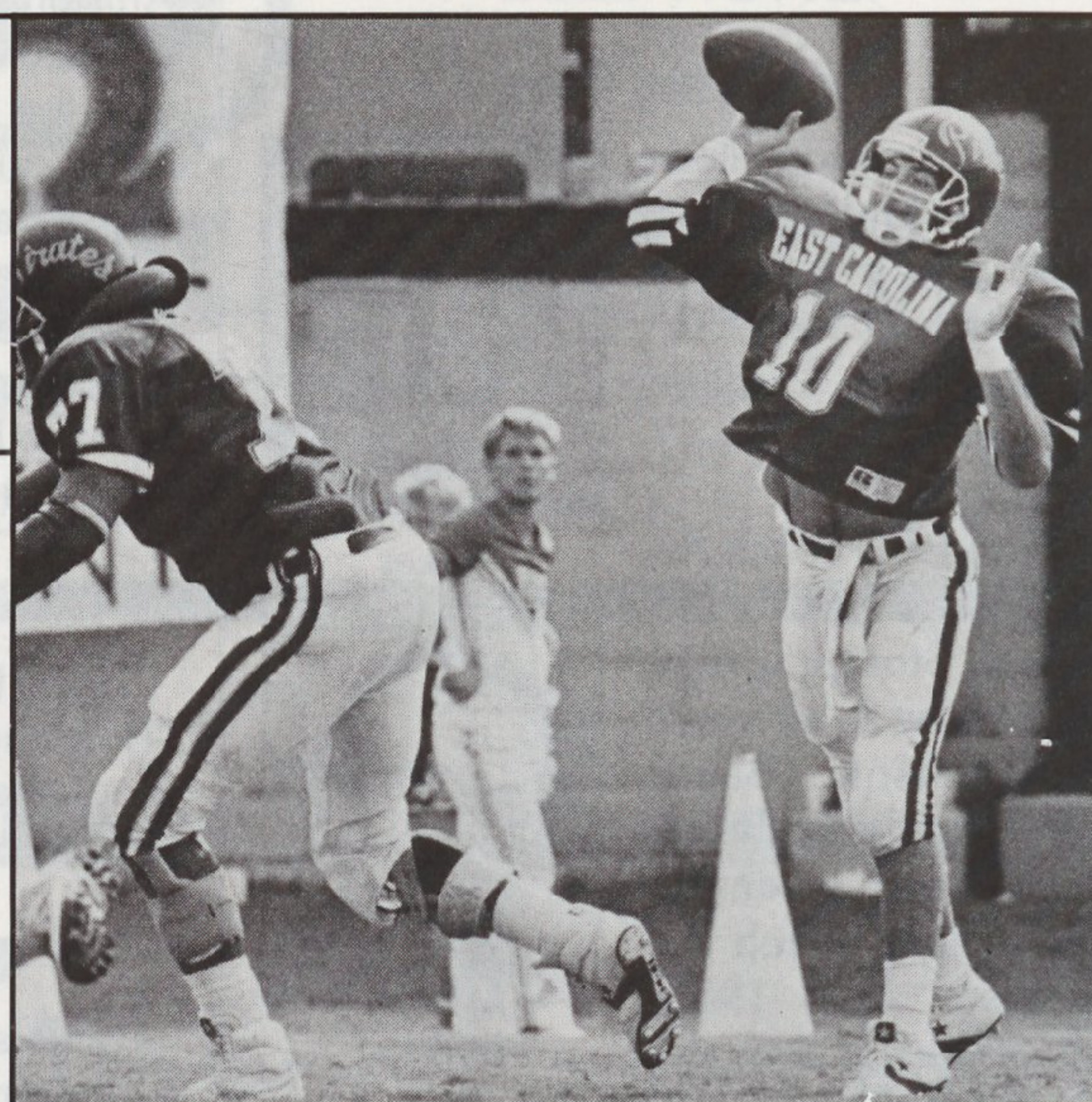
The "King of the Gridiron" scholarship is presented each home football game to the outstanding East Carolina University football player for that particular game as voted on by the media in attendance.

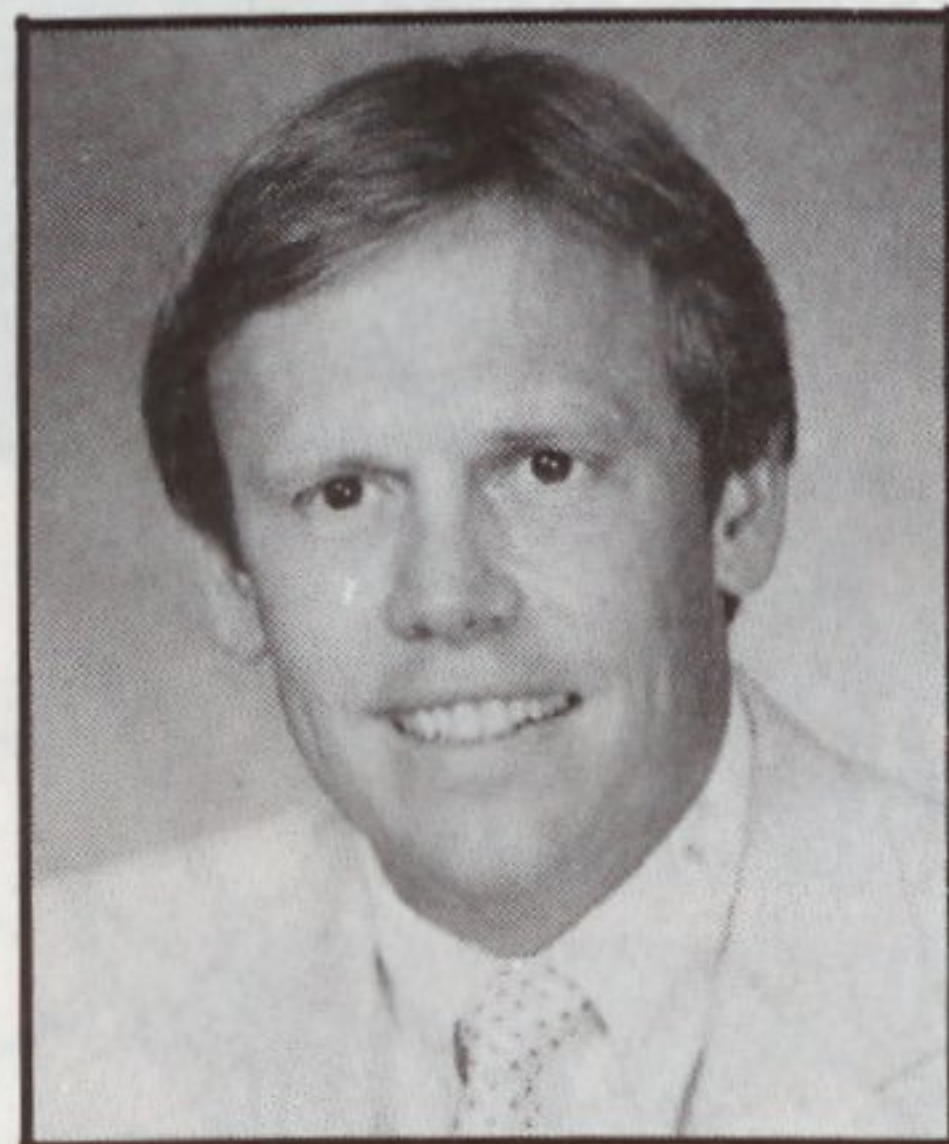

# Pirate Basketball '88-'89

## Optimism Surrounds ECU Camp; Steele Begins 2nd Season

There's a great deal of optimism surrounding the East Carolina basketball program for 1988-89 after the Pirates survived a season with the odds stacked against them during coach Mike Steele's first campaign.

Steele inherited a squad that had only one returning player with any collegiate experience and he was suspended from the team for disciplinary reasons.

That left ECU with a roster of nine players before the season, including only two members who had ever played on the collegiate level and had averaged a combined total of three points. Also, no one on the roster was taller than 6-5.

"My entire coaching staff was taller than anyone on the team," Steele said. "Unfortunately, we also could beat them in some of our shooting drills. I've never heard of a situation on the Division I level like we had last season."

But despite the preseason prognosticators who predicted ECU would be lucky to win a game, the Pirates were sporting a 6-8 record and a 2-1 mark in the Colonial Athletic Association in early January.

"We were playing American in a home league game and had a free throw to win it with no time left on the clock," Steele said. "But we missed the free throw and lost in overtime and never got a break the rest of the season."

"We just didn't have anyone who could take control of a game in the final minutes because no one had ever been in any of the situations before," Steele said. "This season, a lot of that could change as we are older and wiser."

And they have Blue Edwards back.

Edwards was the Pirates' second leading scorer two years ago as a junior college transfer and was generally expected to be an all-conference selection for his senior season. But he was suspended from the team last year and returns after a year of watching from the sidelines.

The return of Edwards alone gives Steele the player he needs when the game is on the line, but ECU also added five newcomers during this past recruiting season to fill more needs. The Pirates also return a group that gained a great deal of

character last winter.

"Players like Gus Hill, Reed Lose, Stanley Love and Kenny Murphy — actually all the guys on last year's roster — were forced to play before they were ready and most of them were playing out of position," Steele said. "They gave us tremendous effort and laid the groundwork for the kind of program we want to have here."

Hill emerged last season to earn first-team all-conference honors and rookie of the year honors in the Colonial after missing two full seasons following knee surgery. The 6-3 Fairfax, VA native averaged 19.3 points and 5.5 rebounds to lead the Pirates before breaking his foot near the end of the season.

Lose had played sparingly as a freshman

and suddenly was thrust into the role of scoring threat as a sophomore. He responded admirably, scoring 15 points per game and averaged just over 38 minutes playing time each outing.

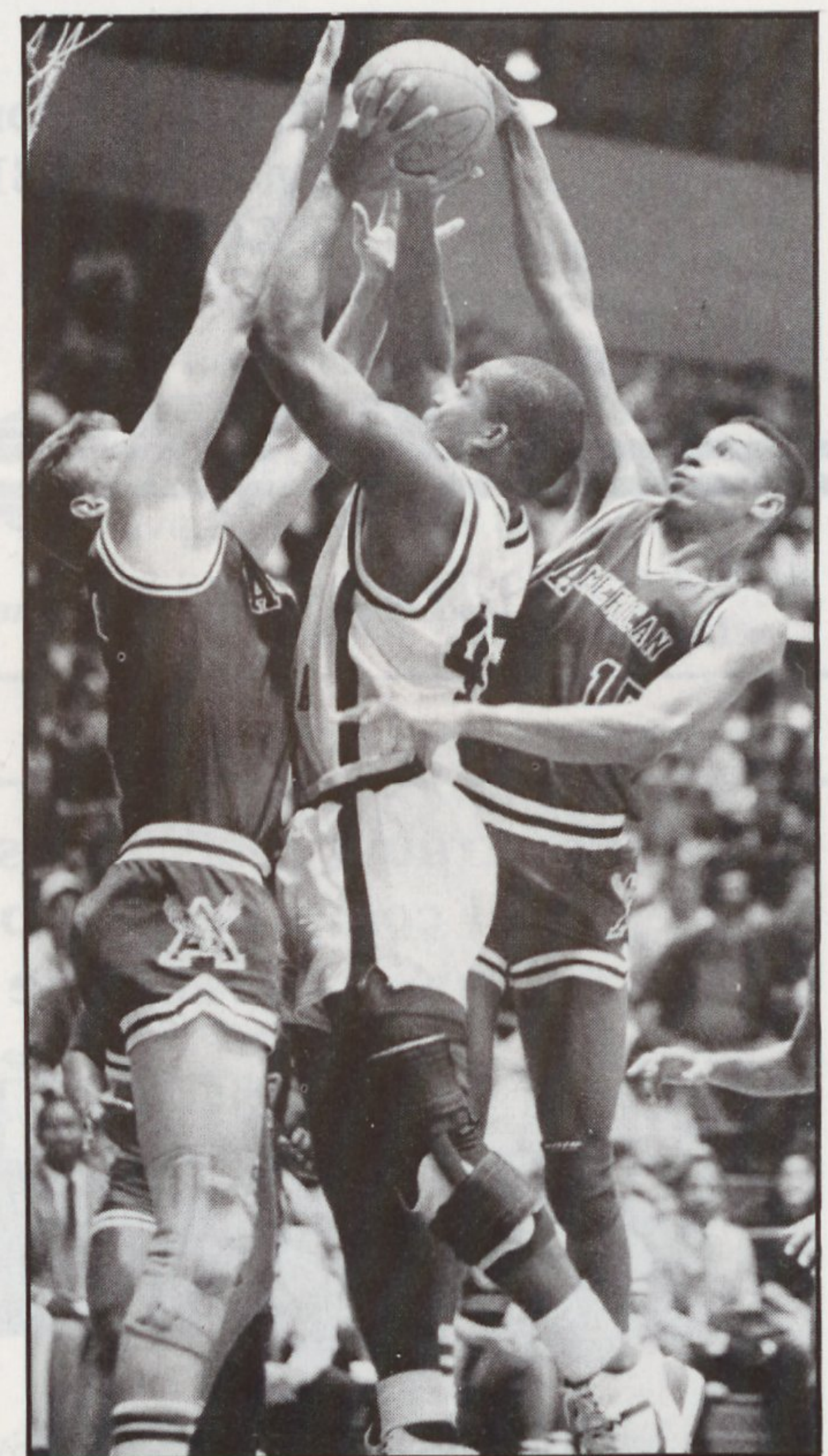
Love started all 28 games last season as a 6-5 freshman center despite playing mostly forward and guard in high school. Murphy was ECU's third-leading scorer at 8.5 ppg as a walk-on. He was a member of an intramural championship team the year before.

The Pirates also return their top two point guards this season in senior Jeff Kelly and sophomore Jimmy Hinton.

The freshmen include shooting guards

Jay Scherer, the 6A player of the year in the state of Alabama, and Jeff Perlich, the second leading scorer in the state of Indiana last season. Forward Casey Mote joins the Pirate frontline as a fine 6-7 shooter and 6-9, 230-pound Brooks Bryant could work into the lineup right away as center for the Pirates.

The JUCO transfer is Kevin Staples, a 6-5 swing forward from Southern J.C. in Birmingham, AL.

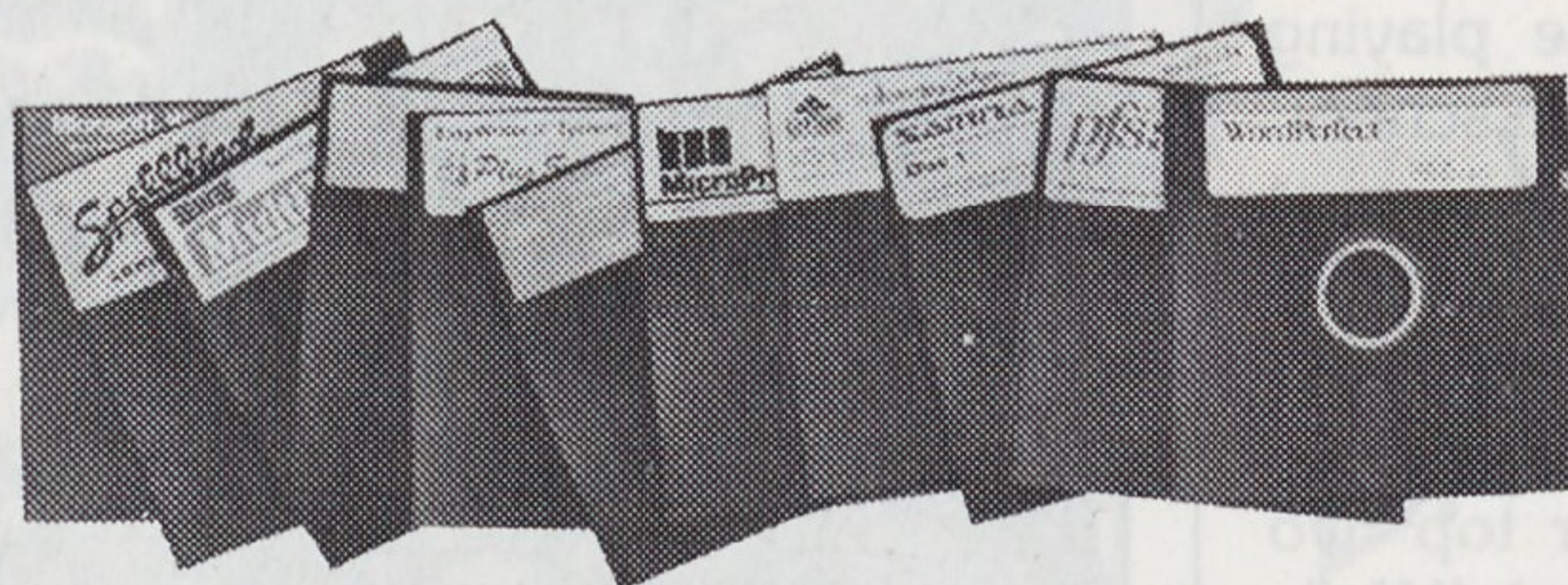

# Lady Pirate Basketball '88-'89

## Pierson Welcomes Six Newcomers, Expects Improvement

Six talented newcomers join four returning starters, giving East Carolina head coach Pat Pierson depth, balance and a reason to be optimistic as the Lady Pirates enter the 1988-89 season.

Perimeter shooting — or the lack of it — ultimately sent ECU to a disappointing 8-20 record a year ago. With the addition of five promising freshmen and one transfer, Pierson hopes her second ECU team has all its weaknesses in check.

"During the off-season we looked to improve on our outside shooting, rebounding and quickness," said Pierson, who enters her second year at ECU and 11th overall. "We were pleased with the group we signed. All could make an impact this year.

"We also return six players who will only improve after a year of learning my system under their belts."

Among the returning starters is 6-2 senior center **Gretta O'Neal Savage**, who is the leading returning scorer (10.7 per game) and rebounder (5.6 rpg.) on the team. Savage could be a candidate for the all-Colonial Athletic Association team.

Also back are senior wings **Chris O'Connor** (7.3 ppg.) and **Pam Williams** (5.6 ppg.), who last year teamed to form ECU's only three-point shot threats. At the point, 5-3 junior speedster **Irish Hamilton** (4.2 ppg., 3.6 assists) will battle newcomers to keep her starting assignment.

The frontcourt appears solid. Joining Savage up front will be either 6-2 senior **Rose Miller**, 6-1 sophomore **Sarah Gray**, who was red-shirted last season, or 6-1 **Kim DuPree**, who transferred in mid-season last year from North

Carolina Central and will become eligible in December.

Six-foot-two **Sandra Grace** gives the Lady Pirates five players over the 6-foot mark.

The tallest of the newcomers is 5-foot-11 **Kathy Allison**, a Fayetteville Westover High product who could help solve some of ECU's rebounding woes this year.

"No starting job is guaranteed," Pierson said. "That will make pre-season practice a little more intense this year."

The most talented of the newcomers may be 5-9 **Tonya Hargrove**, who can play the big guard or either forward position. Hargrove was the Raleigh-area 4A player of the year last season.

Beefing up the perimeter shooting will be **Mechelle Jones** and **Laura Crowder**, a pair of 5-5 bookend guards from the same backcourt at Colonial Heights (Va.) High School. Both are heralded shooters and capable of running the fast break.

**Toina Coley**, a 5-7 wing player from nearby Goldsboro High School, can play any number of positions.

Gone from last year's team is forward

Alma Bethea, who averaged 13.4 points and 8.7 rebounds per contest a year ago. While Bethea's absence will create a scoring void, the frontcourt appears to be the strength of this year's team.

DuPree led North Carolina Central in scoring and rebounding before transferring, and Gray was a member of the CAA all-rookie team two years ago. Savage, a southpaw, has a soft touch in the lane and shot nearly 49 percent from the field last season.

Hamilton and Williams overcame knee surgery to play last season, and O'Connor played well in the latter part of 1988 scoring in double figures seven out of ECU's last eight games.

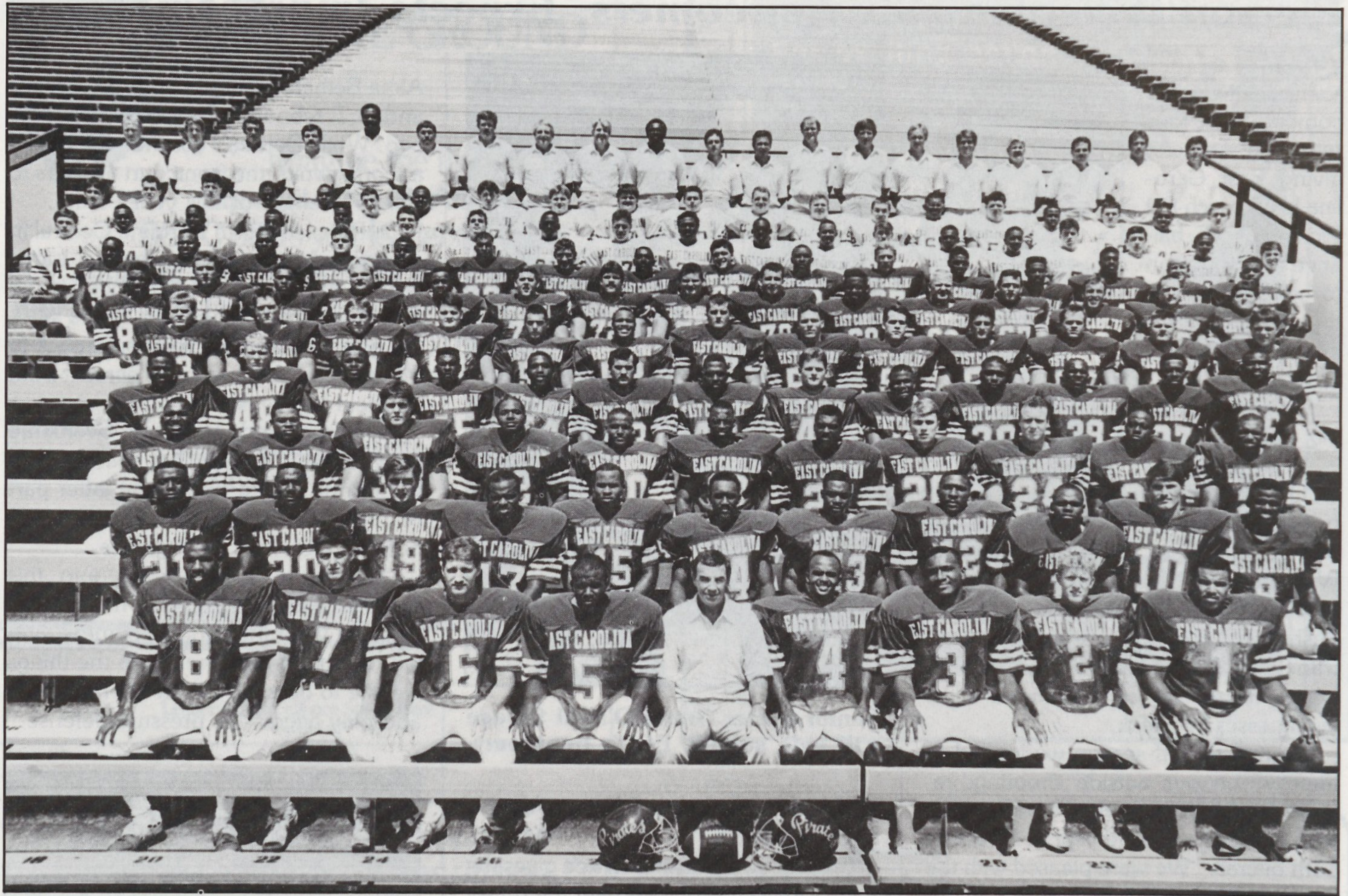
"We are confident going into this season," Pierson said. "We have a nice blend of veterans and newcomers, and we have the personnel to do the things we like to do such as run the fast break and play aggressive pressure defense."

# This Is ECU

Eighty-one years of growth and advancement mark the history of East Carolina University. Since the institution began as a teachers school in 1907, East Carolina has grown along with the town of Greenville and the region.

Following its motto, *SERVIRE: To Serve*, East Carolina has become one of the South's most rapidly developing institutions of higher learning.

Its development has occurred in giant steps in the heart of a region described 25 years ago as a "sleeping giant," just then being stirred to awaken. Then during the last two decades especially, East Carolina experienced spectacular growth, mushrooming from a relatively small liberal arts college into a major university, the third largest in the state, with more than 15,000 students enrolled today.

East Carolina was given university status by an act of the General Assembly of North Carolina in 1967 and with it a mandate to raise and expand its programs and services. Four years later it became a constituent campus of the consolidated University of North Carolina system.

Today, East Carolina has 19 academic departments in its College of Arts and Sciences, ten professional schools including North Carolina's newest school of medicine, the General College, the Graduate School and the Division of Continuing Education.

East Carolina's professional schools are: Allied Health and Social Professions, Art, Business, Education, Home Economics, Medicine, Music, Nursing, Social Work and Technology.

East Carolina University offers undergraduate degrees in 104 program tracks, master's degrees in 87 program tracks and seven Ph.D. programs. The MD is offered through the ECU School of Medicine. The student body is drawn from every county in North Carolina, most of the 49 other states and from some 35 foreign countries. There are approximately 65,000 alumni of East Carolina University.

The doctoral programs, in basic medical sciences, were approved by the Board of Governors in the fall of 1979. This authorization represents a special milestone in the progress of the University, placing it among the six private and public institutions in North Carolina to offer Ph.D. level graduate students.

ECU is located on a 330-acre main campus in Greenville, a city of 44,000 population. There are 90 buildings on the main campus and the medical sciences campus of 42 acres in west Greenville. The university operates 15 residence halls which house more than 5,500 students.

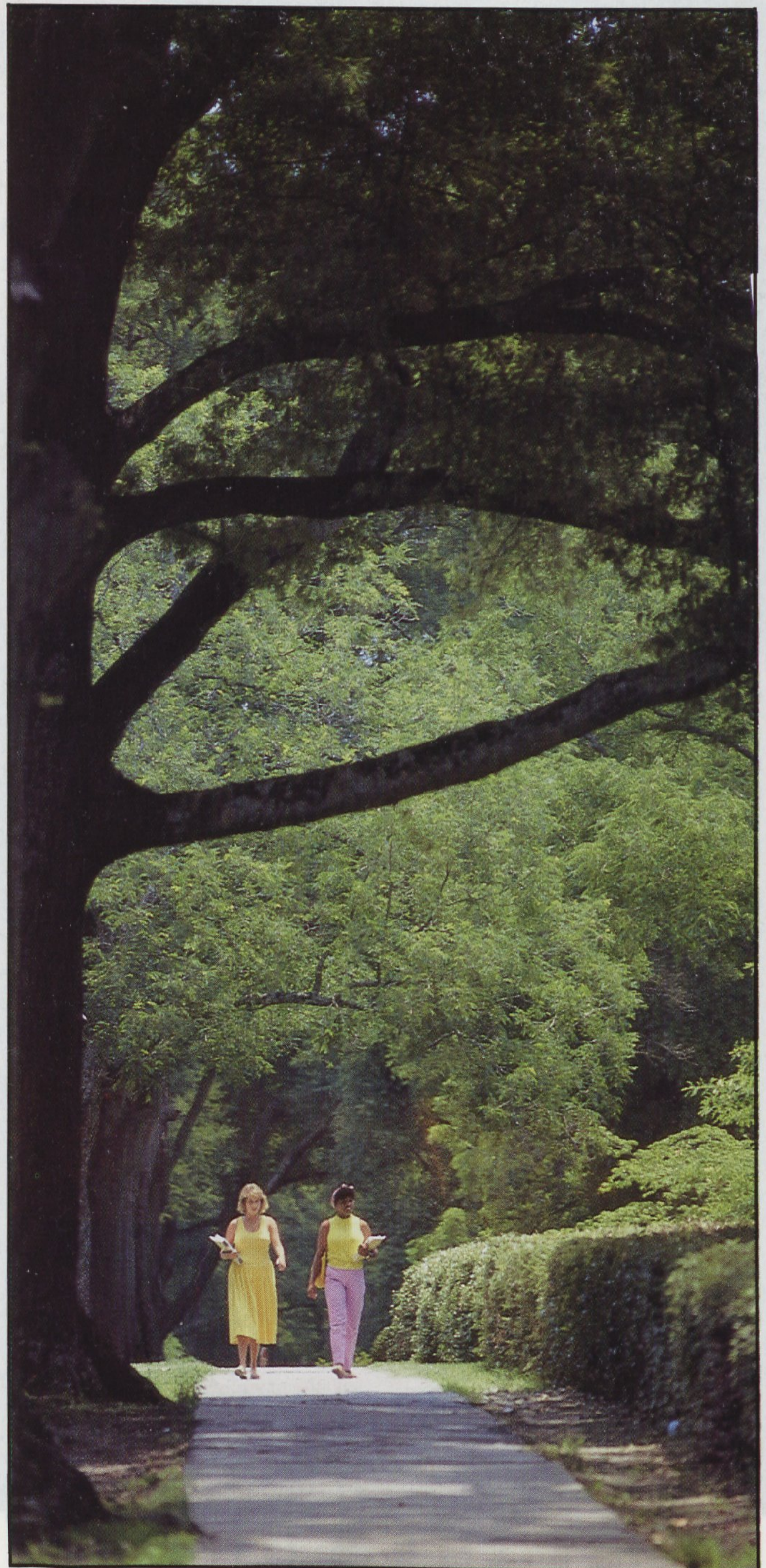
Research grants, contracts and cooperative agreements total more than \$10 million a year in support of research and related service programs at East Carolina University. The university has a total operating budget of \$168 million a year. More than 88 percent of the faculty of 1,021 hold terminal degrees.

Although its growth in size and new programs has been phenomenal, East Carolina University places emphasis upon academic excellence, upon quality rather than quantity.

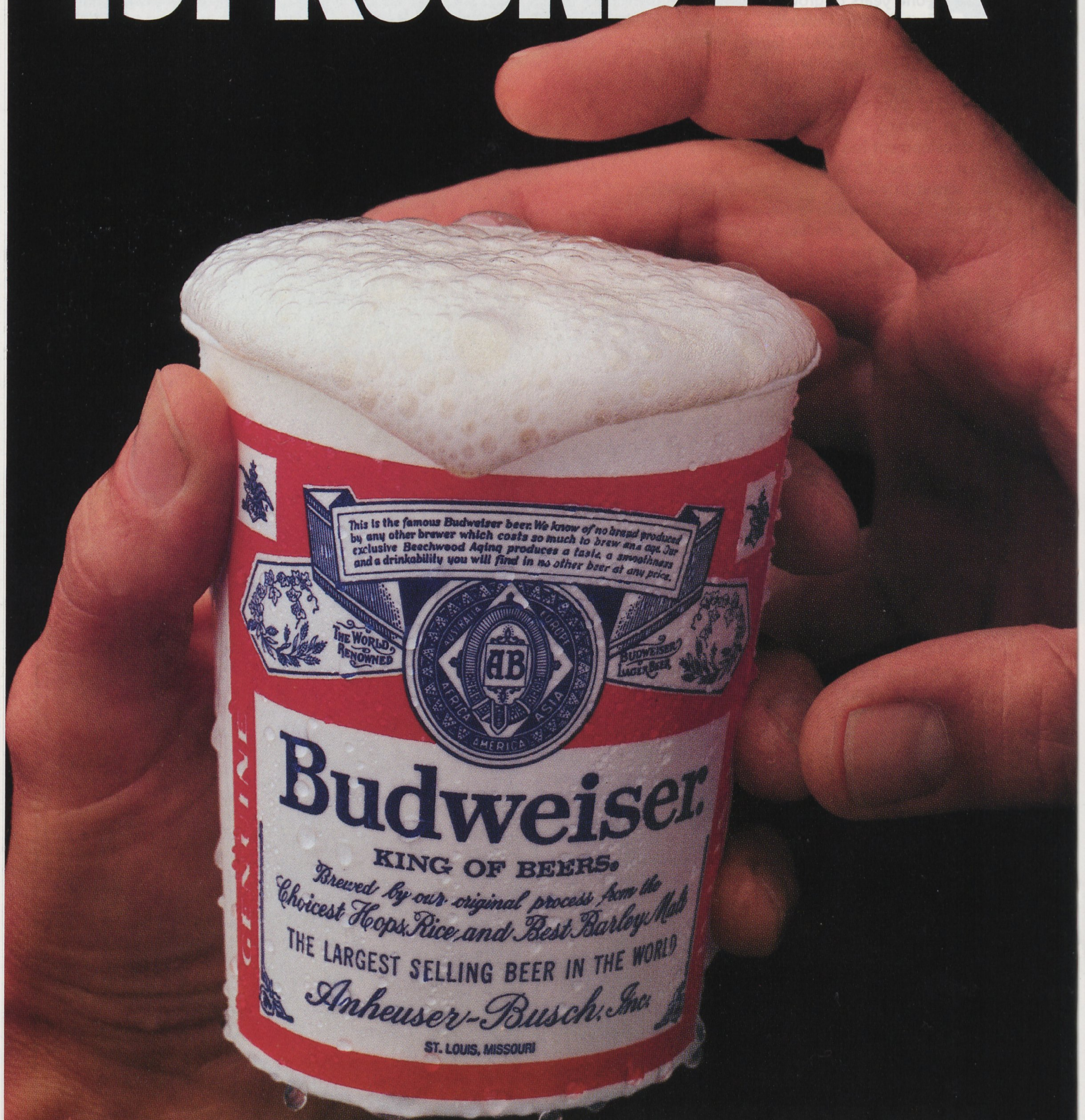
Remarkable growth of faculty research activity has been noted in recent years. The libraries contain collections of more

than 500,000 bound volumes; 8,516 serial subscriptions; 600,000 units of microfilm; 5,201 phonodisc/tape recordings; 320 manuscript collections comprised of 500,000 items and the latest in library-loan systems. The Computer Center also has the latest in modern computer capability to serve the campus.

In all, East Carolina is fulfilling its potential as a university which is increasingly prominent as a center for educational opportunity and service.

# Pirate Sports Network

The Pirate Sports Network is the official radio outlet for East Carolina University football. All activities of the Pirate Sports Network are coordinated, produced and directed by Jeff Charles, Director of Electronic Media/Promotions at East Carolina.

The 1988 season will mark the second year of a multi-year agreement with Capitol Radio Networks to distribute the network via satellite. Capitol Radio Networks is a part of the Capitol Broadcasting Company of Raleigh, N.C., and the network provides news and sports programming for more than 150 radio stations throughout North Carolina and Virginia.

This year's expanded network — the largest ever at ECU — includes new affiliates in the Charlotte and Tidewater, Va., markets, and two 100,000-watt FM affiliates (originating station WDLX 93.3 in Washington and WKTC in Tarboro anchor coverage in eastern North Carolina).

Charles begins his first season as the play-by-play "Voice of the Pirates." He comes to East Carolina from Virginia Tech where he served as the "Voice of the Hokies" and Director of Radio/Television Affairs for the past five years. Charles also has college play-by-play experience with the University of Illinois and Furman University.

The Ohio native has a major market radio background, as he was sports director of WSB in Atlanta from 1980-82, serving as the "Voice" of the Peach Bowl and a nightly sports talk show host on the 50,000-watt clear channel station.

The Georgia Associated Press named him the state's best play-by-play announcer and *United Press International* awarded him first place for the best sports coverage in the state.

Charles and his wife Debby have two children, Heather (15) and Britt (13).

Joining Charles in the broadcast booth will be Carlester Crumpler, one of the all-time greats in Pirate football history.

Crumpler returned to his alma mater this past July as Director of Administrative Services for the department of athletics. The all-time leading rusher in ECU history was a 1980 inductee into the East Carolina Sports Hall of Fame.

Crumpler, who will serve as color analyst for all 11 Pirate games this season, gained broadcasting experience as the sportscaster on WNCT-TV in Greenville from 1979-81, and was sports director of a Wilson radio station for two years in the mid-70's.

The 37-year-old Wilson, NC, native completed his career at ECU with a school-record 2,889 rushing yards including a school record 1,309 yards in 1972. Crumpler went on to play professionally with the Buffalo Bills and Washington Redskins of the NFL and the Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League.

A 1974 graduate of ECU, Crumpler and his wife have three children.

The Pirate Sports Network is a wholly-owned and operated facility of the East Carolina University athletic department.

# USL Tackle Large Reason For Ragin' Cajun Upswing

**W**as someone asking which player is Mark Hall?

If so, give that person this piece of advice. Don't look far, look up.

Hall towers over the line, standing 6-foot-5, and tips the scales at 285 pounds.

Although just in his second year at USL, Hall has certainly been recognized throughout the country. *College and Pro Football Newsweekly* placed him on the second team of its preseason All-America squad.

*The Sporting News* ranked Hall seventh among the country's top defensive tackles, and *Athlon's Southeastern Football* labeled him as one of the top tackles heading into his senior year.

But the publicity hasn't left Hall without a positive outlook on the season.

"They say that there's always room for improvement. And for me to be a better player, I have to keep my weight down and continue to play with high intensity," he said.

That kind of attitude is what makes coach Nelson Stokley pleased to see Hall striving for further improvement.

"The best thing that Mark has going for him is the effort that he puts forth," the

third-year USL coach said.

And Stokley also agrees that Hall should be aware of his weight.

"He came to USL over 290 pounds," Stokley said. "I think if he plays a few pounds under 280 that would make him more effective and definitely quicker. If he could lose a few pounds as the season progresses, that would only help him."

Hall, being conscious of his role on this year's team, admits that he and defensive end Chris Gannon are looked upon for leadership qualities, not by just the defense, but the entire team.

And Hall's performance against Cal State Fullerton in the season opener showed critics that he plans to play 1988 vigorously.

"I thought that game was really outstanding for Mark," said Stokley. "He played like an All-American and he was in control of himself, attacking the line and playing good technique."

Hall also added his name into another column of the Cajun statistics with a 13-yard punt return against the Titans.

"I don't think we'll look for Mark to do that in every game," Stokley laughed. "But I'll say that it typified the way he plays and is able to react to the ball."

And Hall's response: "That's got to be one of the funniest things to ever happen to me. I laughed about it (after seeing the films) 'cause I've never caught a punt in my life."

"It was definitely a different experience for me. I didn't think about it when it happened. All I could do was react as if it were a normal play."

Hall, however, didn't just happen into this point of his game. It took dedication to work and getting himself mentally prepared to play football again.

After spending his freshman season at LSU, Hall, whose high school years were spent at Patterson (La.) High School, became distraught with the program and left Baton Rouge to play a year at Mississippi Gulf Coast Junior College.

"Leaving LSU and going to a junior college was like playing a mind game," Hall explained. "But I also think that it strengthened me mentally and made me work even harder to get back to major college football."

And how does Stokley view Hall's progression?

"I'm pleased with where he is right now," Stokley said. "He really worked hard in the off-season program. He improved during the spring, and we saw then that he was beginning to get back to his old self."

The USL coaching staff knew of Hall's ability when he graduated from high school.

Hall attests, "I visited USL coming out of high school, and I said to myself that I was least interested in coming here. But since coach Stokley took over and I talked to him and his staff, I found out that USL is big time."

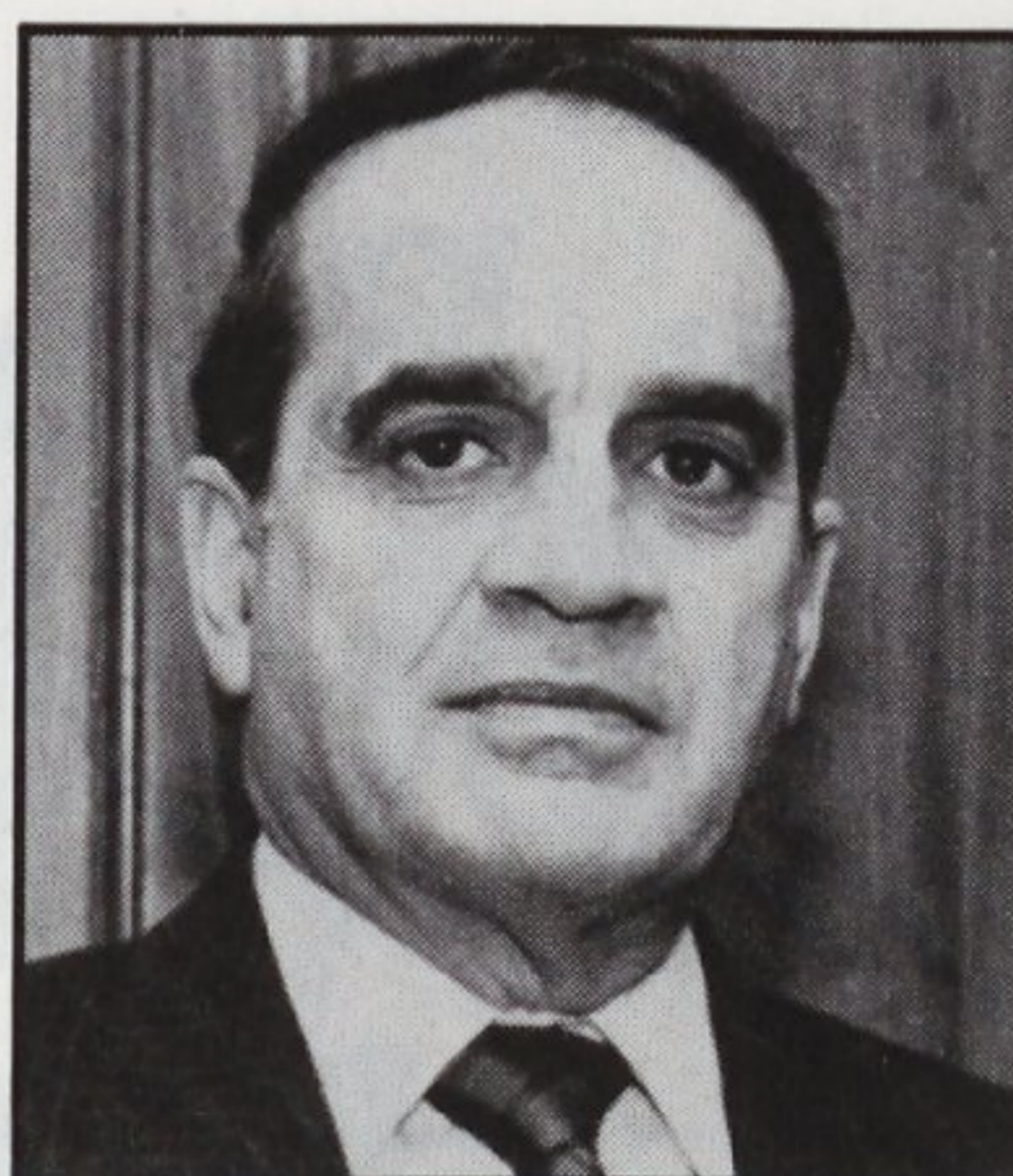
And unquestionably, Hall has been a large reason for the Cajuns' upswing.



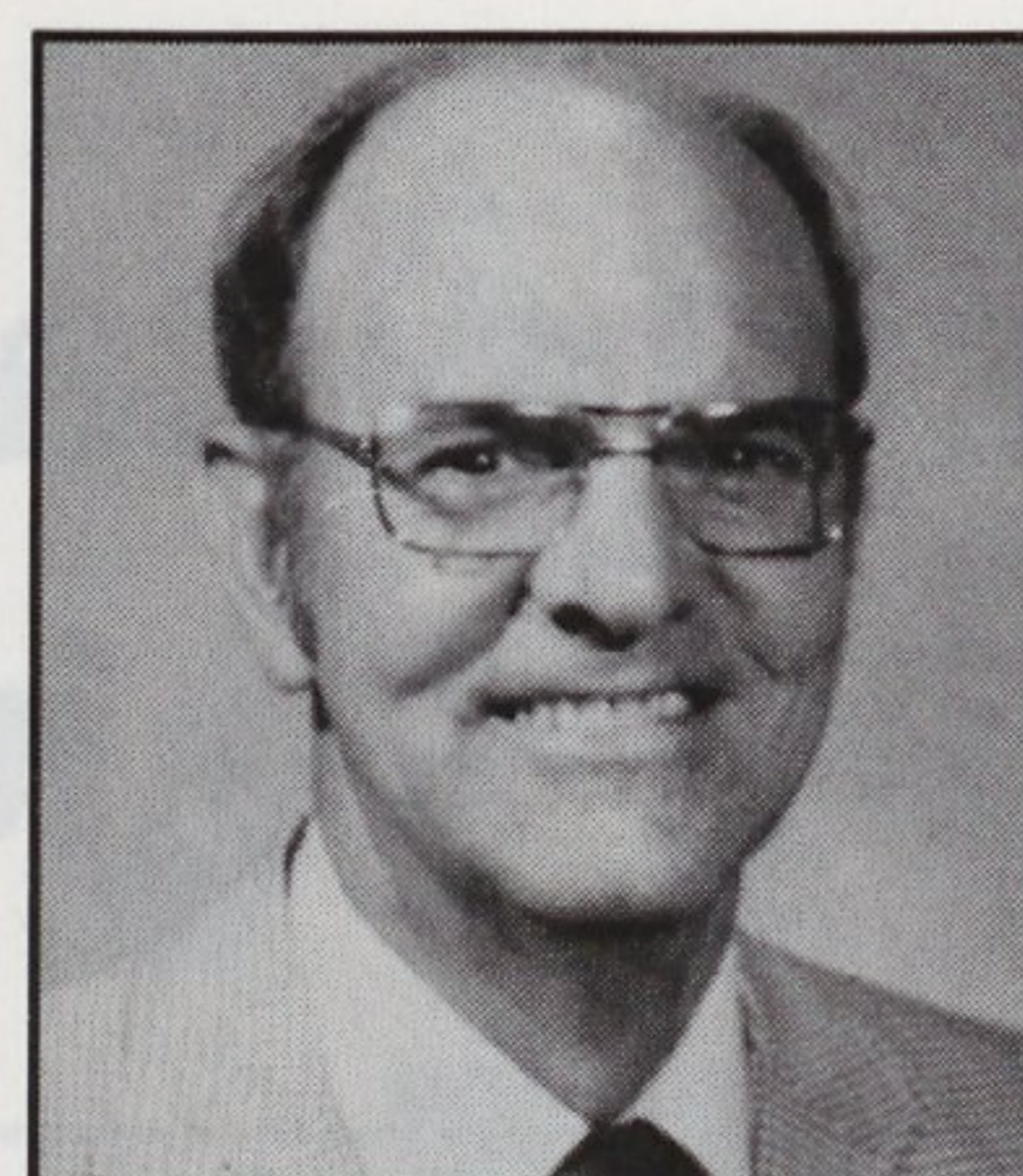

## Ficklen Stadium

The James Skinner Ficklen Memorial Stadium was dedicated on September 21, 1963, with East Carolina defeating Wake Forest 20-10.

The dedication game was the culmination of a dream come true for the then East Carolina College and all of eastern North Carolina. The original plan was announced on Oct. 7, 1961, by Dr. Leo Jenkins, Chancellor of the College, at a meeting of the Society of Buccaneers.

Within a year, \$283,387 had been raised, although the goal had been only \$200,000. With the funds in hand, Ficklen Stadium was built.

The original stadium consisted of the permanent stands on the south side, a small press box and the old lighting system that was removed after the 1974 season. Total cost was \$300,000.

The north side permanent seating was constructed in 1968, increasing the stadium seating capacity to 20,000.

The stadium was named for the late James Skinner Ficklen, a Greenville resident, who distinguished himself as one of America's leading tobacconists. At the time of his death in 1955, Ficklen was President and Chairman of the

Board of the E.B. Ficklen Tobacco Company of Greenville. He was a close friend of the College and established a financial aid foundation, the Ficklen Foundation, to aid students of the College.

The first major change in Ficklen Stadium was the lighting systems, a change that occurred just before the 1975 season opened. The old inner stadium lights on six poles were removed and replaced with six towers outside the stadium. The system is a combination of metallic and incandescent lights. There are 288 fixtures of 1500 watts each on six 162-foot towers. Cost of the system was \$450,000. Engineers say ECU has the best lighted stadium in the southeast.

A radical change greeted fans as the 1978 season opened. An expansion on all four corners boosted Ficklen's seating capacity from 20,000 to 35,000, the third largest stadium in North Carolina. This expansion was made possible with 2½ million dollars through a drive in the spring of 1977.

In addition to more seats, an ultramodern press box with three levels and an elevator for access was built. The much needed press box is one of the finest in the country with space for 92

writers and an entire floor for electronic media. Also, a modern scoreboard with a lightbank message center was placed on the east end of Ficklen.

The 1985 season saw all-time and single-game attendance records fall in Ficklen Stadium as the Pirates drew a school-record 153,182 fans and saw the stadium's first sell-out at 35,000 — 35,047 versus the University of South Carolina on Oct. 26, 1985, while 1987 saw two additions to the top 12 Ficklen crowds.

# History Of ECU Athletics

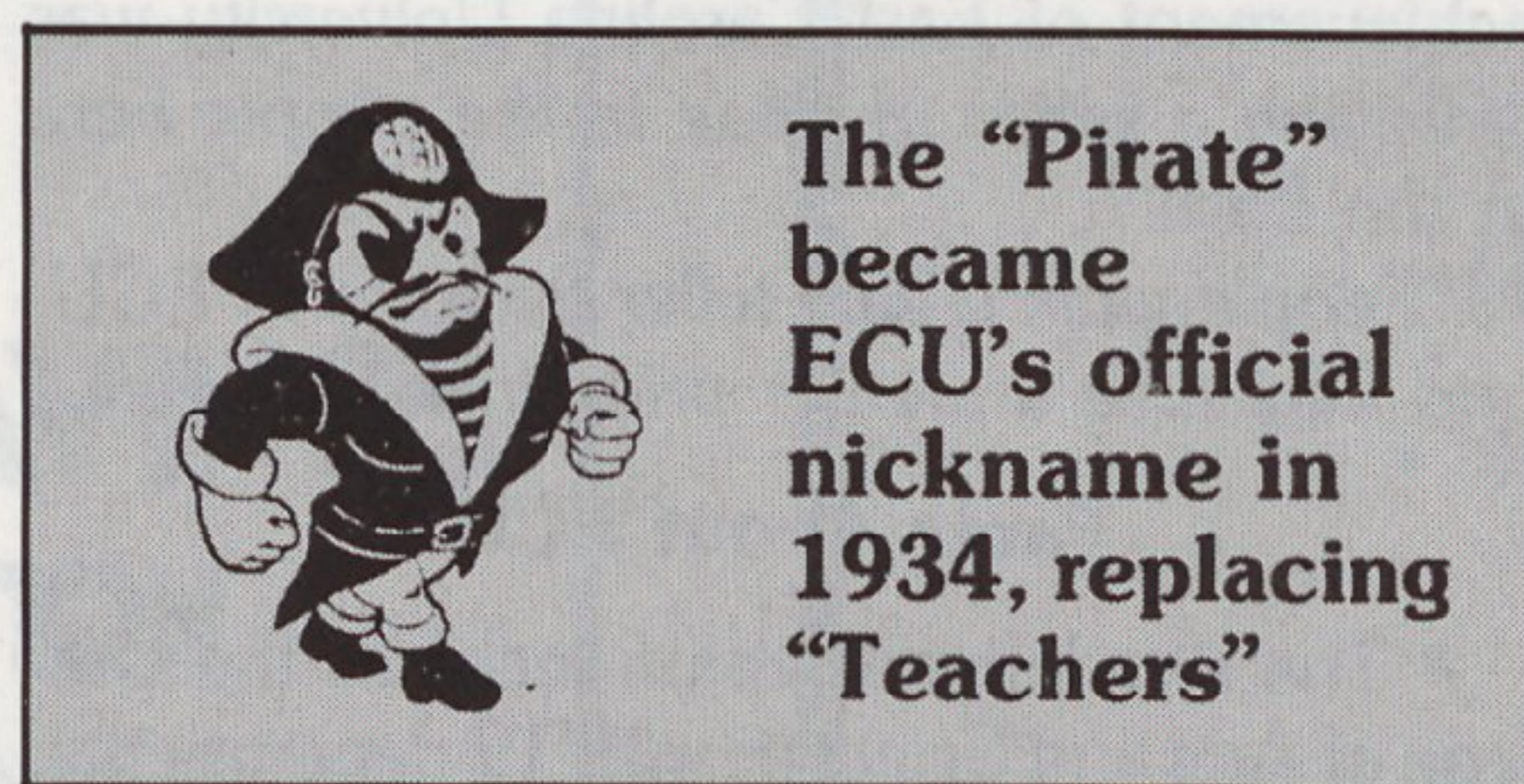
East Carolina University has carved a rich history and tradition in college athletics despite the fact that the institution is a relative neophyte in the area of sports endeavors.

Following is a chronological history of athletic highlights at East Carolina:

- 1909**—A student committee established Old Gold and Royal Purple as the official school colors.
- 1910**—The first sport team was established in baseball at East Carolina Teachers Training School, as the institution was then named. Professor Claude Wilson was the manager of the first athletic team. The first teams for women were established on an intramural level in the sports of basketball, tennis and volleyball.
- 1920**—The first athletic facilities were developed on the Greenville campus. The first facilities included an outdoor basketball "ground" and six tennis courts.
- 1932**—On January 12 the first intercollegiate basketball game was played as East Carolina defeated Campbell College. This first basketball team went on to record 10 wins and 10 losses. In 1932 the first football team was organized at East Carolina Teachers College. Ken Beatty of Greenville served on a volunteer basis as the institution's first football coach. This first football team did not win a game, in fact, did not score a point. There were a total of seventy-five male students at ECTC of which twenty-five participated on the football team.
- 1933**—On November 11 the football team made

history by recording its first victory over Campbell College. "Crack" Rogerson scored the first East Carolina football touchdown in the first victory.

- 1934**—The nickname "Pirates" was adopted.
- 1941**—While the Japanese were preparing to bomb Pearl Harbor the Pirates were making sports history in Greenville, N.C. Coach John Christenberry coached the Pirates to a perfect 7-0 record in football.
- 1947**—East Carolina Teachers College joined the North State Conference, which included: Appalachian, Atlantic Christian College, Lenoir-Rhyne College, Elon College, High



- Point College and Western Carolina.
- 1957**—Dr. Ray Martinez's swim team won the NAIA National Championship.
- 1961**—Coach Jim Mallory led the Pirate baseballers to an NAIA National Championship. East Carolina College was accepted into NCAA membership.
- 1962**—Clarence Stasavich, highly successful football coach at Lenoir-Rhyne College, was hired as football coach at East Carolina.
- 1963**—Ficklen Stadium, a 17,000 seat facility, is dedicated in a football game against Wake Forest University as the Pirates defeat the Demon Deacons by a score of 20-10.
- 1964**—East Carolina is admitted to the Southern Conference (The Citadel, Furman, Davidson College, Richmond, George Washington University and William and Mary)

- on probationary status.
- 1966**—East Carolina becomes full member of Southern Conference and attains tie from football championship in first year of full membership.
- 1975**—Ficklen Stadium is enlarged to seat 35,000 and the East Carolina University football team defeats the University of North Carolina by a score of 38-17.
- 1976**—East Carolina withdraws from the Southern Conference after winning the Commissioner's Cup, symbolic of the most successful overall athletic program in the conference, five times in an 11 year membership period. East Carolina chose to drop out of the Southern Conference due to NCAA realignment which placed the conference in NCAA Division I-AA. ECU chose to be a Division I-A school and pursue a course of major college competition.
- 1985**—ECU joins the Colonial Athletic Association (American University, US Naval Academy, James Madison University, UNC-Wilmington, William and Mary, George Mason University, and Richmond) in sports other than football. In football ECU has chosen to compete as a Southern Independent.

East Carolina today competes in all sports at the major level and is enjoying success. The Pirate baseball program has enjoyed 37 winning seasons in the past 38 years. Since leaving the Southern Conference the Pirate football schedule has included: North Carolina, Duke University, South Carolina, Wake Forest, The University of Miami, Missouri, Florida State, West Virginia, Pittsburgh, Penn State, Auburn, LSU, and Illinois.

The East Carolina Sports Hall of Fame was initiated in 1974 as an organization to honor those individuals who have, by their direct participation in East Carolina University intercollegiate athletics, brought outstanding recognition to themselves and to the University.

The first honorees were inducted during Homecoming festivities at half-time of the East Carolina—The Citadel game in 1974. Ten members were selected for the first year. No more than four members may be selected for any one year in the future.

To be selected, a committee of five persons must vote with 80% of those giving their approval. Those five shall be the official selection committee.

To be eligible for selection, a person must not have been connected with the University in the capacity to which the

Literatures, Geography and Planning, Geology, Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Safety, History, Library and Information Studies, Mathematics, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Psychology, Sciences Education, Sociology and Anthropology and Theatre Arts.

- There are seven professional schools in the Academic Division: Art, Business, Education, Home Economics, Music, Social Work and Industry and Technology.

- The Health Sciences Division includes the Schools of Medicine, Allied Health Sciences and Nursing for a university total of 10 top-ranked, nationally-recognized professional schools.

- ECU's graduate program in Maritime History and Underwater Archaeology, in the Department of History, is world-famous. Its

# Sports Medicine Records

The East Carolina University sports medicine division and curriculum, reputed to be one of the finest in the Southeast, affords every Pirate athlete the best available care and treatment of injuries.

Headed by ECU's sports medicine director Rod Compton, who is a Certified Athletic Trainer and a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA), and the American Orthopedic Society for Sports Medicine, the East Carolina sports medicine program offers the best possible prevention, immediate treatment, and rehabilitation of injuries.

Compton, who earned degrees from Ohio University and Bowling Green State and served as Editor-in-Chief of the NATA Journal for six-and-one-half years, is also the director of the ECU Sports Medicine Conference, which is held annually in April on the East Carolina campus.

Compton (entering his 19th season) is assisted by team physician Dr. James McCallum, Greg Beres, Certified Athletic Trainer, and Karen Baker, Certified Athletic Trainer, as designated by the NATA. All serve on the staff of the Sports Medicine Conference and as faculty for the Sports Medicine Curriculum within the Department of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Safety.

They are assisted by more than a dozen fine community-based professionals who lend valuable time to the program and 30 to 35 undergraduate students majoring in East Carolina

University's sports medicine program.

East Carolina's current Sports Medicine Center, which has been in operation since 1971, is housed directly behind Ficklen Stadium. The Center contains equipment for the prevention, evaluation, immediate care and rehabilitation of athletic injuries. The staff, students and consultants are eagerly looking forward to the continuing expansion of the program and facilities with the move into the Sports Medicine/Physical Education Building, in mid-1989, and the upcoming graduate curriculum in "Sports Medicine/Athletic Training."

The "Sports Paramedics," as Compton refers to his staff, are in attendance at every athletic event that involves East Carolina University athletes. Radio communication from practice field to the center is a must and a sports medicine vehicle provides instant transportation for injured athletes to the center. Prevention, evaluation, treatment, and rehabilitation are the main objectives of the Sports Medicine Division and when an injury does occur, Compton and his staff provide on-the-spot treatment to make certain the injury does not become more serious.

The Sports Medicine Curriculum, a

"The most important thing is to know what you are working for. If you know that, then the when, how, and where take care of themselves."

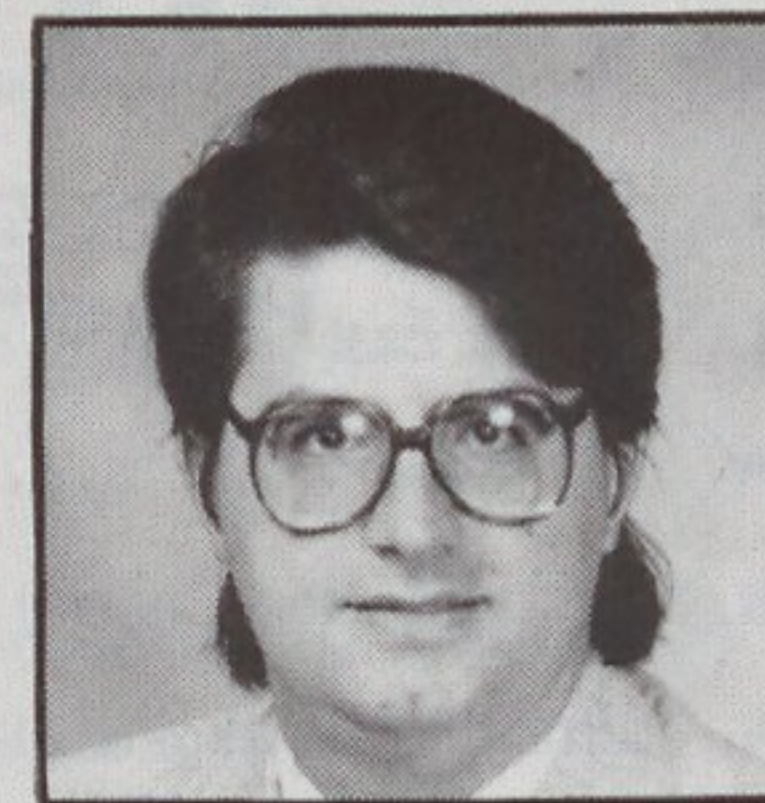
The pair have another common bond besides sports and ECU. They share a faith in God that brought them together in the first place.

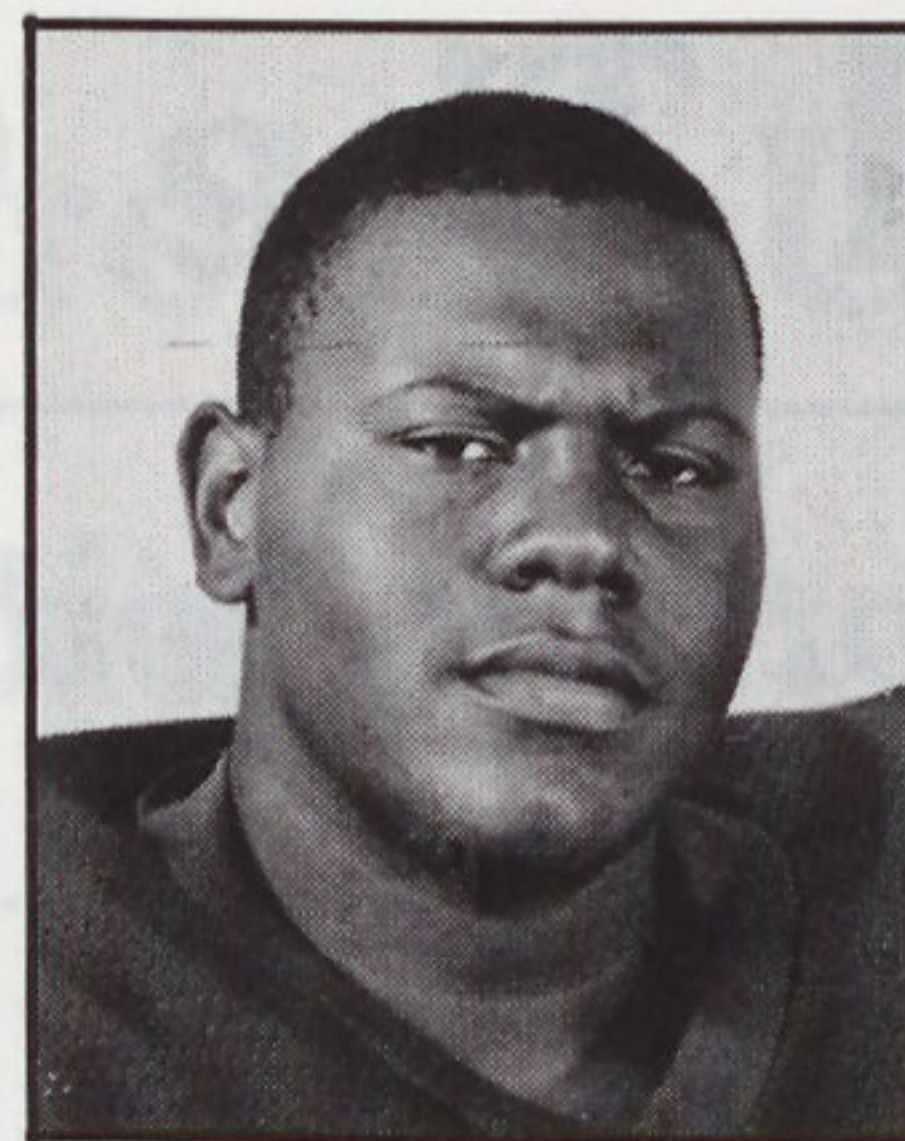

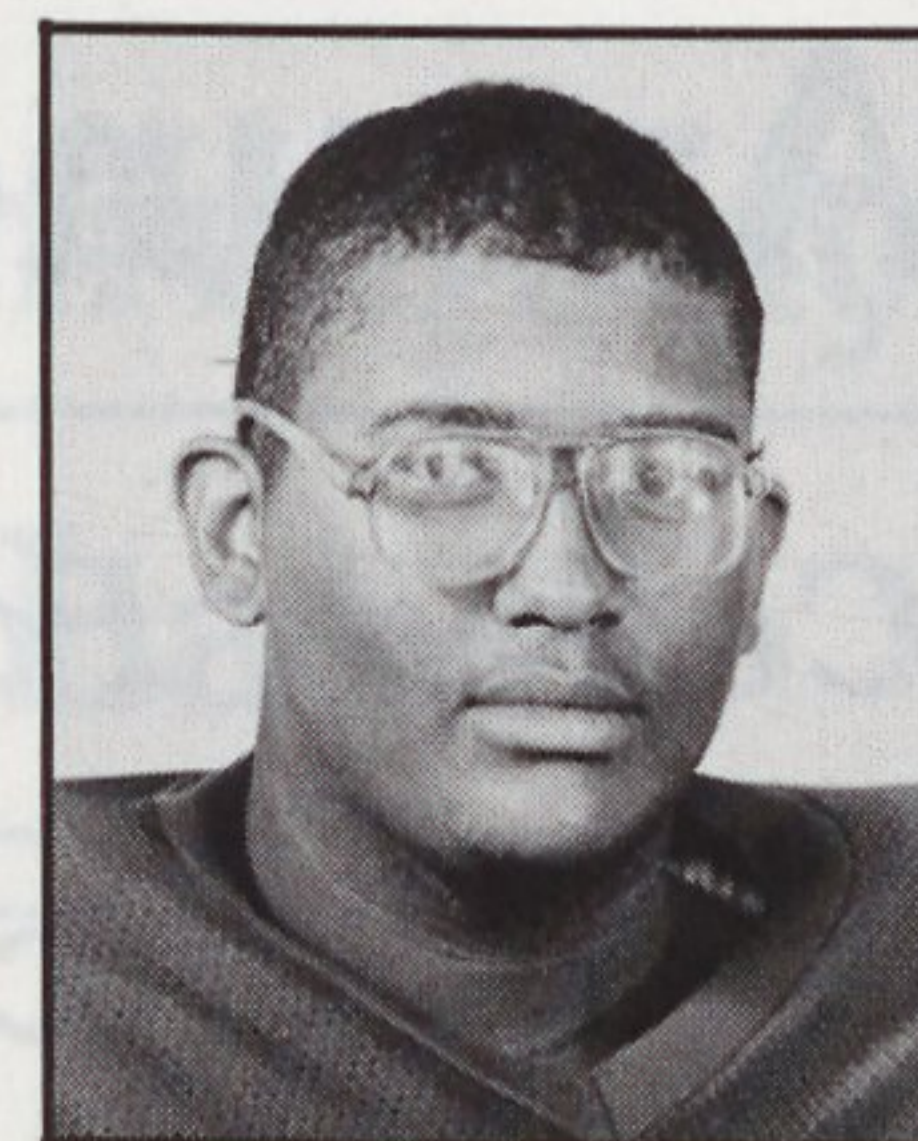

"You never have to worry about Tom not wanting to talk, but then there are times you wish he would be quiet, like when he snores!" says McCallop about his roommate.

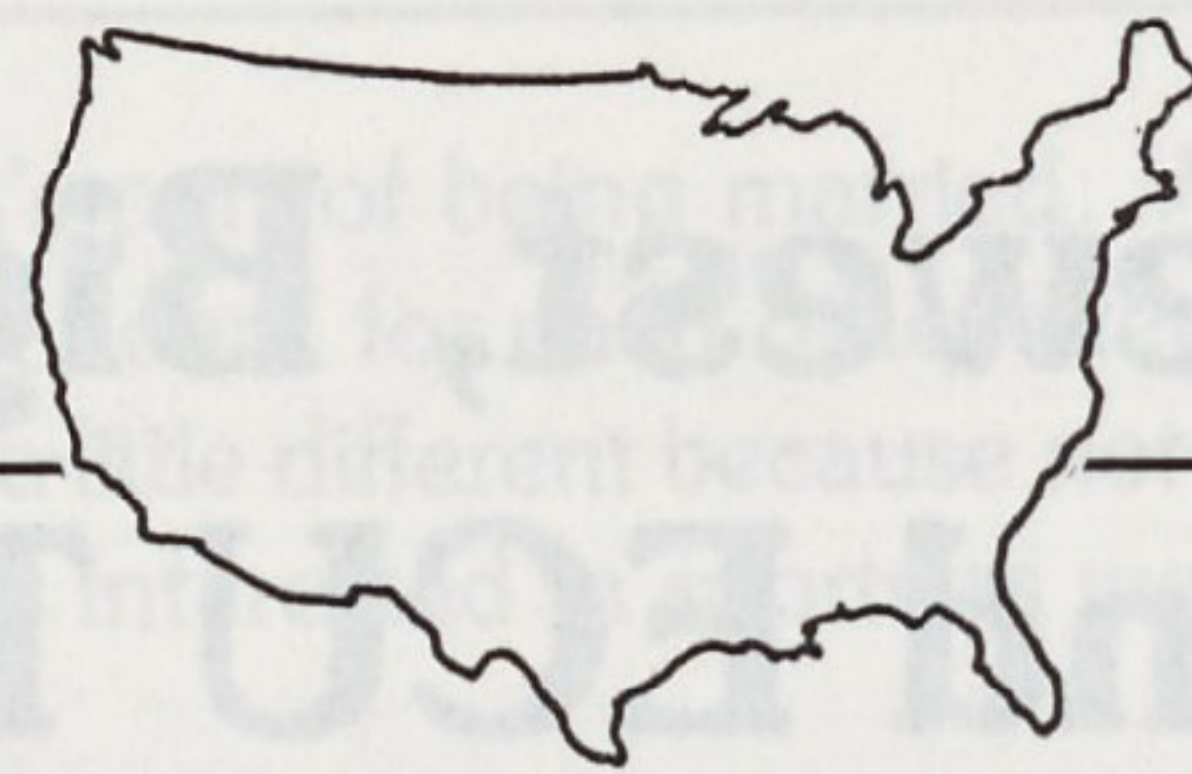

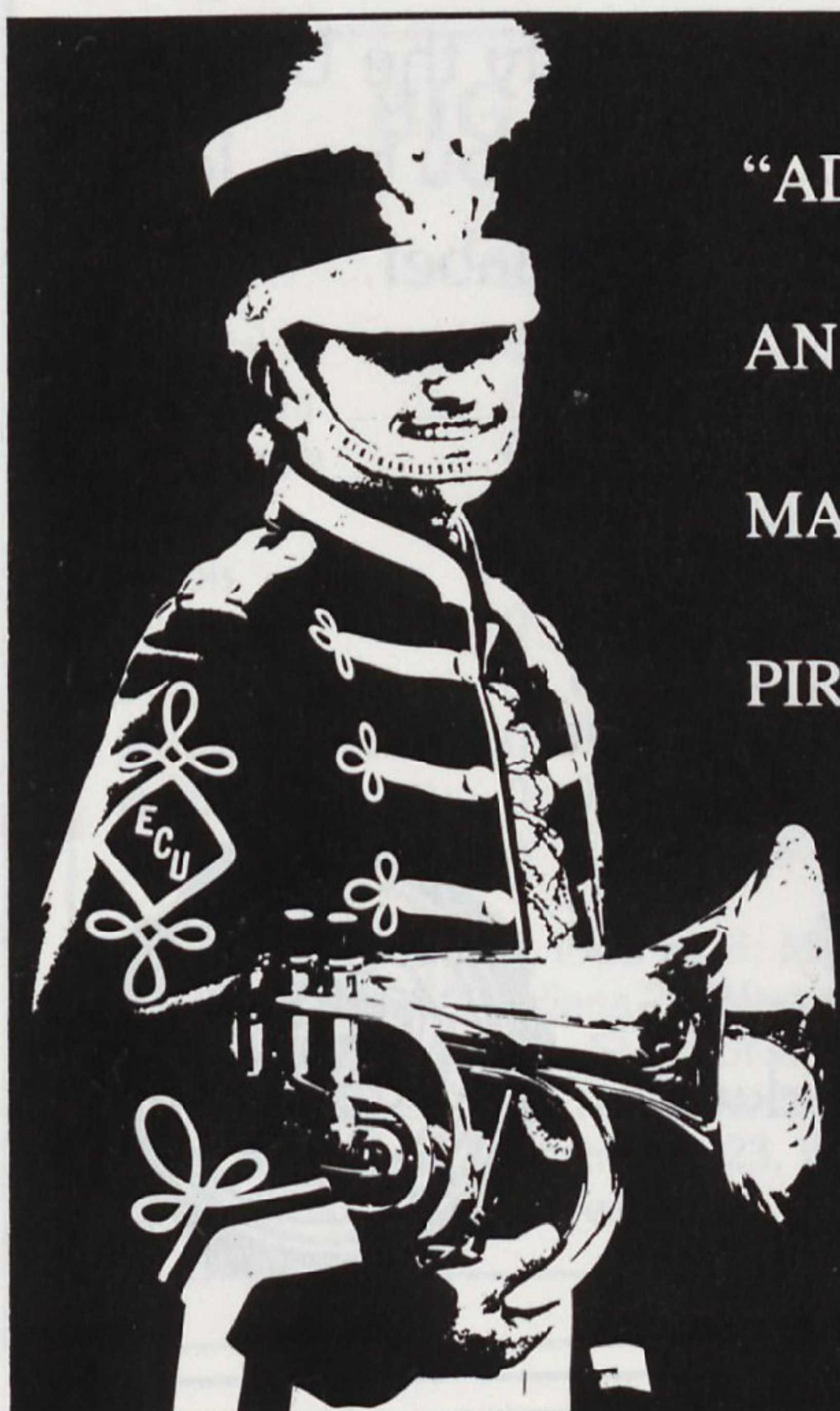

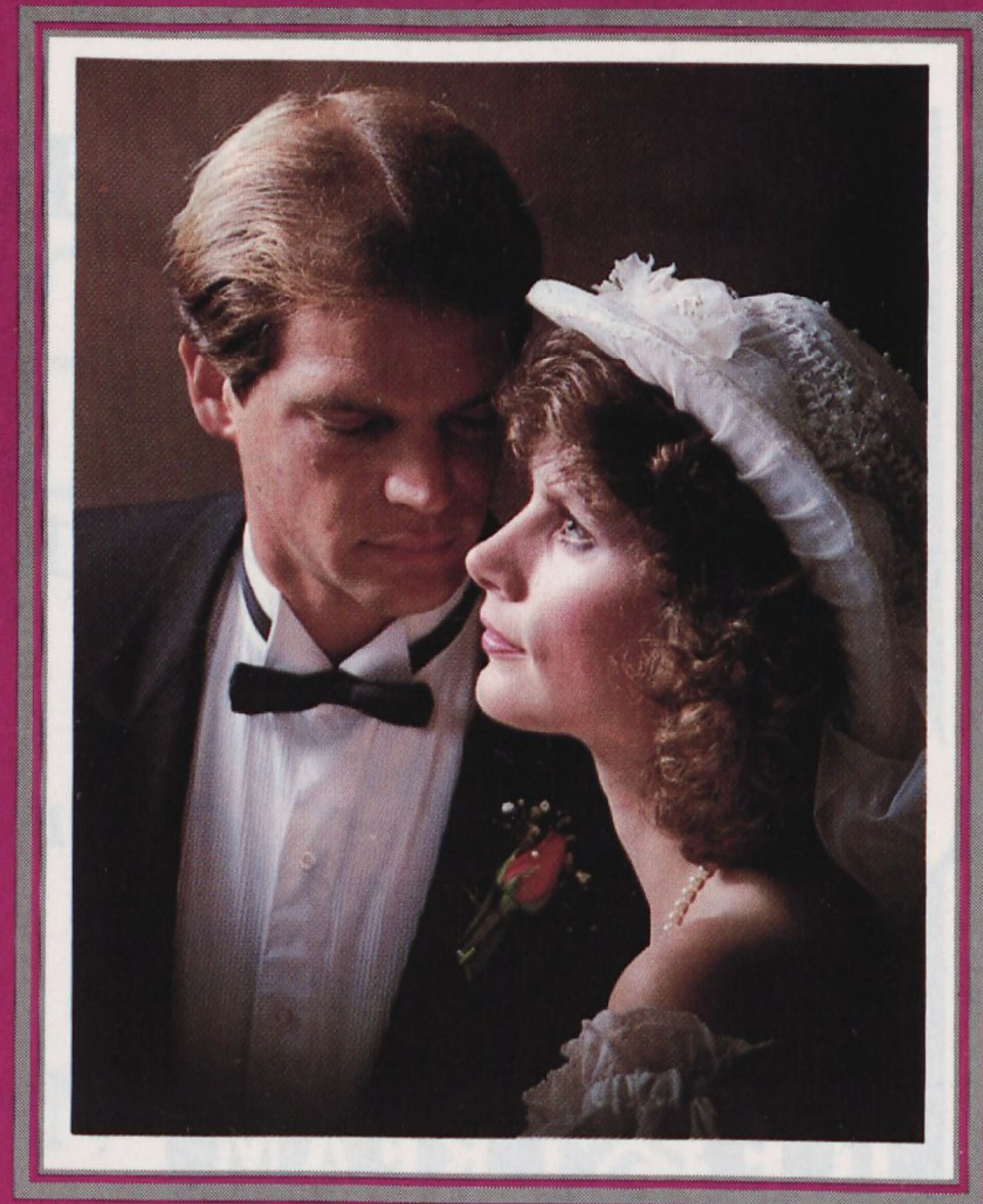
