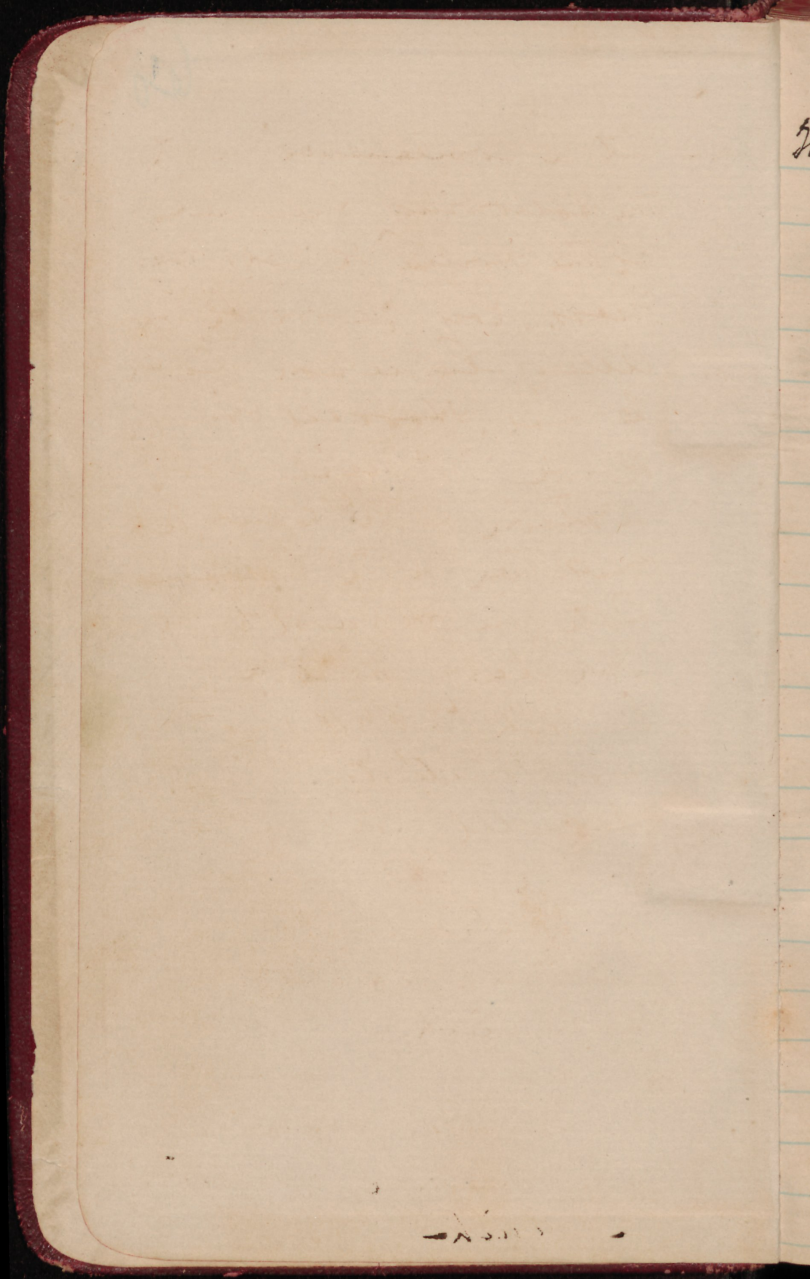

Expensive Trials of Misdemeanors.

The Virginia legislature has passed a joint resolution ordering a vote at the November election on the question of so amending the Constitution as to dispense with jury trials in cases of misdemeanor.

This would be a good move for our people to make. There is a very great expense attached to minor offences which our law compels to go over to the Superior Court. At the last term we notice in particular a case of larceny of one head of cabbage valued at 10 cents. The costs of this case was in the neighborhood of \$25. The defendant got four months on the public roads. At the September term of our criminal court there were two or three cases of carrying concealed weapons, the defendants submitted in all three, a fine of \$5 and cost bill of \$25 or \$30 was taxed in each. Had these cases been within the jurisdiction of justices of the peace, the school fund would have received fines in each case of \$30, and perhaps the cost bill would have been \$2 or \$3, whereas the school fund did in the September term referred to get but \$5 in each case and the costs bills run up to enough to make \$25 or \$30.
