

EAST CAROLINA UNIVERSITY CURRICULUM COMMITTEE
MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 24, 1992

The Curriculum committee met Thursday, September 24, 1992, at 1:30 p.m. in Brewster B-103. Members present were Harris, Grossnickle, Wittman, Lapas, Neal, Cox, Gartman, Carlton, Prasad, Powers, Smith, and Allen. Member absent was Wilentz.

The minutes of March 26, 1992 were read. It was noted that the Department of History did not support the change in the social science requirement as previously reported. The minutes were approved as amended.

John Marshall and David Gobeski, Industry and Technology, presented a new course proposal, MANF 5090, 5091, Fluid Power Circuits and Lab. Powers moved acceptance as amended, Prasad seconded. The motion passed.

Edward Wheatly, Marketing, requested a reduction in prerequisites for MKTG 4992, International Marketing. Gartman moved acceptance, Harris seconded. The motion passed.

Al Muller, English, presented a revision in the English Concentration for all affected teaching degrees. Powers moved acceptance as amended, Lapas seconded. The motion failed. Members of the committee expressed concern about the selection of required language courses and recommended the proposal be returned to the English Department for further study.

Grossnickle moved, Carlton seconded and the committee passed the following changes: unbank ANTH 3024, 4400, 4401, 3002; BIOL 5750, 5751; ENGL 3760; PHIL 3311, 4312. Bank PHIL 2272, 5273; COAD 5380; LIBS 2123, 4323, 4324; SCIE 2110, 2111.

Grossnickle informed the committee that the Registrar has changed the scheduling procedure which has caused problems for departments wanting to offer banked courses. Cox moved that the chair be delegated the authority to unbank courses pending subsequent action by the committee. Carlton seconded. The motion passed.

Gary Bird, Theatre/Dance, presented revisions to the BFA degree with emphasis in Musical Theatre; a revision of THEA 3090, Musical Theatre Techniques I; new course proposals for THEA 3095, Musical Theatre Techniques II, and THEA 4080, Musical Theatre Practicum. Lapas moved to accept as amended, Gartman seconded. The motion passed.

Vila Rosenfeld and Randy Joyner, Education, presented revisions in the BSBE programs in Business Education and Marketing Education and Administrative Services and Information Processing; a request to delete the Administrative Services minor; revisions in the BS in Home Economics Education; and numerous course changes. Harris moved to accept as amended, Powers seconded. The motion failed. The committee asks that the departments involved reconcile recent changes in General Education requirements and their proposed changes in programs and to resubmit the package in proper format.

No representative was present to present changes submitted by the Psychology Department. Cox moved to table these items, Harris seconded. The motion passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:11.

EAST CAROLINA UNIVERSITY CURRICULUM COMMITTEE
MINUTES OF OCTOBER 8, 1992

The Curriculum committee met Thursday, October 8, 1992, at 1:30 p.m. in Brewster B-103. Members present were Harris, Wilentz, Grossnickle, Wittman, Lapas, Neal, Cox, Gartman, Carlton, Powers, Belch, and Allen. Members absent were Smith and Prasad.

The minutes of September 24, 1992 were read and approved.

Grossnickle moved, Belch seconded and the committee passed the following changes: unbank ANTH 3020 and bank CDFR 4390, 5392, 5351.

Marlene Springer, Academic Affairs, met with the committee for an exchange of information and ideas.

Larry Means, Psychology, presented proposed changes in admission requirements for a psychology major (a minimum 2.0 gpa for admission) and revisions in credit for PSYC 5990, 5991 and 5992 (these courses will no longer satisfy requirement for 5000-level course requirement), thus altering the BA degree in Psychology. Harris moved acceptance, Wilentz seconded, the motion passed. A request to change credit for PSYC 2101 from 3 s.h. to 4 s.h. was presented. Harris moved to return this course to the Psychology Department for further consultation with departments affected by the proposed change. Wilentz seconded. The motion passed.

A delegation from the School of Business (Ed Wheatly, Buddy Zincone, Umesh Gulati, Fred Schadler) and Jon Heise, International Programs, presented changes in the BSBA degree requirements including a new course proposal, MKTG 3852, The Cultural Environment of International Business, to be cross listed with INTL 3852 and taught by School of Business faculty; changes in prerequisites for FINA 4654; a request to designate MGMT 3352, MKTG 4992, FINA 4454, and MKTG 3852 as courses which would meet the international requirement of the School of Business curriculum; changes in the Areas of Concentration in Banking and Real Estate; and requiring all students majoring in business take either PHIL 2274 or PHIL 2275 as one of their humanities courses in meeting the General Education requirements. Carlton moved acceptance as amended, Cox seconded. The motion passed. A request was made to require all students majoring in business to take BIOL 1060, Environmental Biology, as one of their science courses in meeting General Education requirements. Cox moved and Powers seconded a motion that this request be returned for further consultation with the science departments. The motion passed.

Al Muller, English, presented a revision in the English Concentration for all affected teaching degrees. Wilentz moved acceptance as amended, Powers seconded. The motion passed.

Bruce Albright, Physical Therapy, presented changes to the BS degree requirements in Medical Record Administration, Occupational Therapy and Physical Therapy; changes and renumbering of HPRO 5011, 5012, 5013, 5030, 5031, 5014. Wittman moved acceptance as amended, Gartman seconded. The motion passed.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:30.

TEACHING EFFECTIVENESS COMMITTEE REPORT

Selection Procedures for the Robert and Lina Mays and Robert L. Jones Alumni Teaching Excellence Awards

1. Each faculty unit is invited to nominate candidates for the annual Alumni Teaching Awards. Each unit is to develop its own nomination procedures based on Faculty Senate Resolution #91-29, "Seven Characteristics of Effective Teaching," and should allow consideration of any eligible faculty member who requests consideration for nomination. No more than one nominee for each ten faculty members in the academic unit can be nominated.
2. Any full-time faculty member who has taught at ECU for three or more years is eligible to be considered for a teaching award. Four years must have elapsed before a faculty member who has won can be considered again. The candidate is to turn in all evaluative materials to his or her unit administrator by November 15 each year (with the exception of 92-93, when the date shall be January 15, 1993).
3. Each unit will forward the following materials for its nominees to the Ad Hoc Teaching Awards Committee:
 - A. List of all courses taught over the past three years and representative samples of course outlines, tests, and teaching materials. Samples do not have to include all courses taught.
 - B. Student evaluations for three years, and the corresponding grade distributions for each course.
 - C. Peer evaluations, if available, or other approved evaluation methods as listed in Faculty Senate Resolution #91-28, "Methods for Assessing Teaching Effectiveness."
 - D. Three to five letters of support from current or former students (not to exceed two pages each). Include names, addresses, and phone numbers of students.
4. The Ad Hoc Teaching Awards Committee will be created by the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs and the Chair of the Teaching Effectiveness Committee. It will be chaired by a member of the Teaching Effectiveness Committee and have at least one member who is experienced in classroom observation and evaluation. The Committee will receive the materials, which will be read by at least three committee members, and evaluated using the criteria in Faculty Senate Resolution #91-29. The seven characteristics of effective teaching will all have equal weight.
5. A list of finalists and their evaluations, not to exceed twelve, will be forwarded to the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs for review. The Committee will request that the unit administrator for each finalist forward a letter of support to the Vice Chancellor.
6. Upon approval by the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, the final pool of twelve applicants will be contacted and videotaped in class. An entire class will be videotaped, and then the candidate will select a twenty minute segment for review by the Committee.
7. The Committee plus two Alumni Association representatives will evaluate the materials, including the video tapes, and by scoring determine the two winning candidates.
