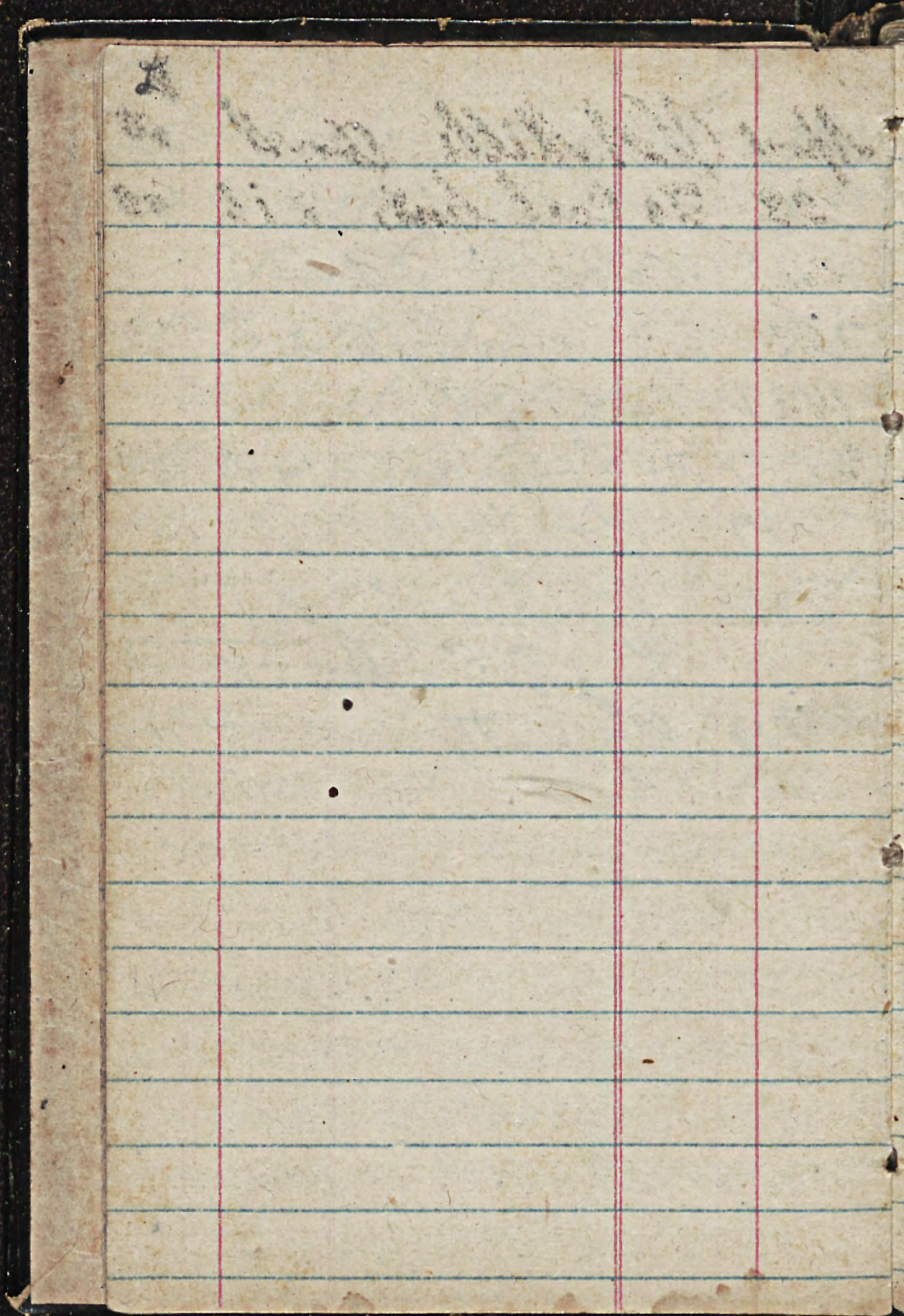

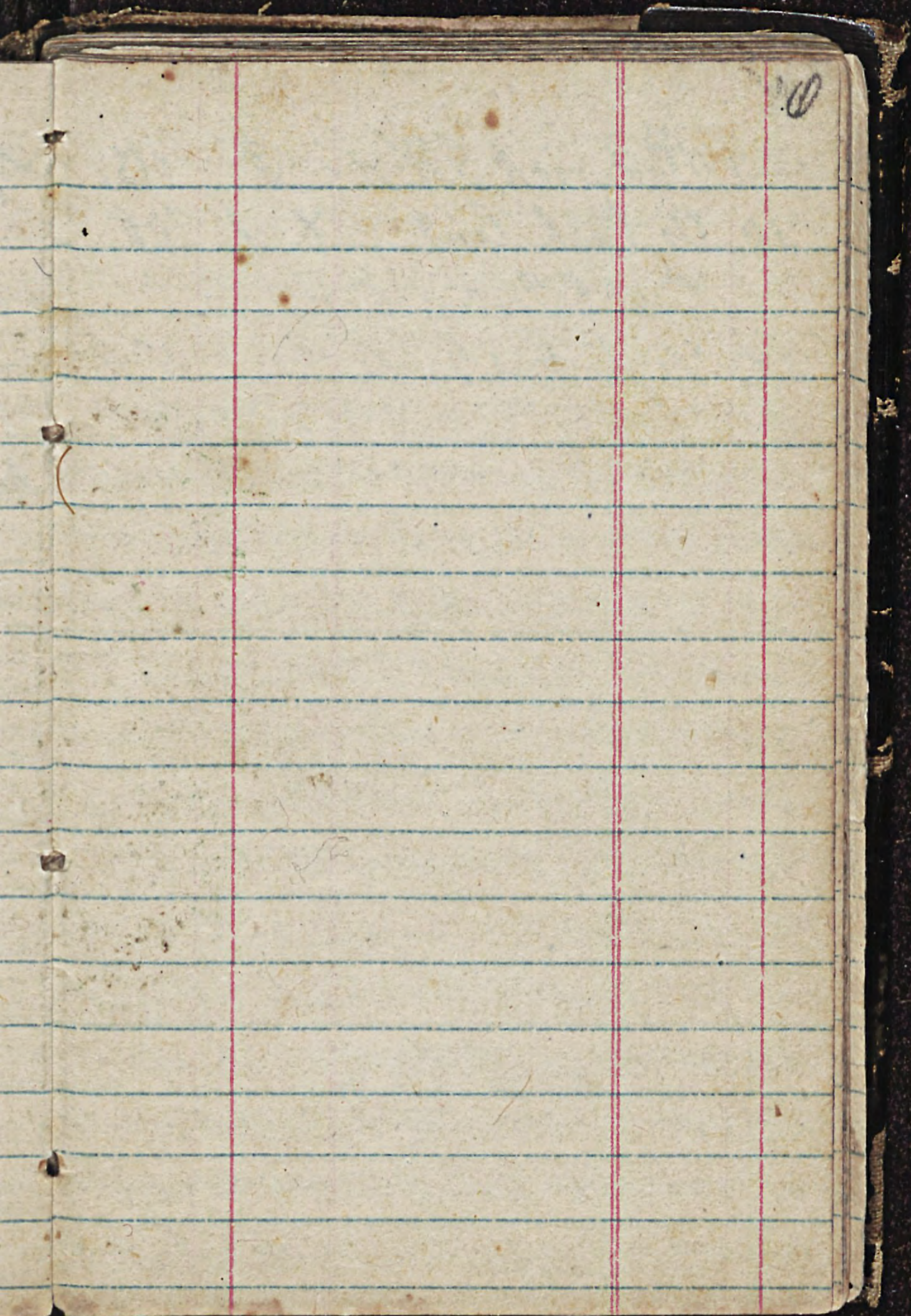

One load of prisoners  
left this prison for an  
Exchange Oct. 12<sup>th</sup> 1864

Second load left Feb.  
13<sup>th</sup> 1865.

I went to the Hosp. Jan. 29<sup>th</sup>  
and returned to my ward Feb.  
11<sup>th</sup>. One load of prisoners  
left here for to be exchanged  
Feb. 20<sup>th</sup>. One left Feb.  
25<sup>th</sup>. One left March 2<sup>nd</sup>.  
One left March 10<sup>th</sup>. One left  
March 14<sup>th</sup>.

I was admitted to the Hosp.  
March 4<sup>th</sup>

Discharged Apr. 24<sup>th</sup>

Admitted to the Hosp. May 25<sup>th</sup>  
Discharged " 27

Our April 29<sup>th</sup> 1863

I started from the Brigade  
-Guard-House April 30<sup>th</sup> about  
8 O'clock P.M. and got to my Regt.  
~~Friday~~<sup>Thursday</sup> evening at Frederic-  
-ksburg and Saturday May 2<sup>nd</sup>  
we marched 12 miles above Fred-  
ericksburg and went into a  
battle the same evening next  
morning we entered into  
another battle and kept  
it during the day with a  
heavy loss on our side of killed  
and wounded

Colleton's Brigade  
left Camp near Fort Royal  
to reinforce our army at  
Fredericksburg April 29  
and got there & staid till  
Friday May 1<sup>st</sup> then we still  
advanced our march about  
12 miles that day, next morn-  
ing we went on and enter-<sup>ed</sup>  
into a battle that evening  
about 1 hour before sun-  
set which soon ended.

May 3<sup>rd</sup> we went into  
it again which was not  
so easy got out of.

May 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> we lay in  
line of battle behind a  
breastwork.

Friday June 5<sup>th</sup> 1863.

We started on a march from  
Fredericksburg & marched 15 miles.

Saturday 6<sup>th</sup>

We lay over till 2 O'clock and  
then marched eight miles.

Sunday 7<sup>th</sup>

We marched 18 or 20 miles.

Monday 8<sup>th</sup>

We marched about 12 miles  
which put us beyond Culpeper  
County House.

Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup>

We lay over till 3 O'clock and  
then counter-marched near  
Culpeper Co. H. and back again  
to the same camp.

Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup>

We marched a short distance.

Thursday 11<sup>th</sup>

We marched about 15 miles.

Friday 12<sup>th</sup>

We marched about 20 miles which  
put us beyond Front Royal.

Saturday 13<sup>th</sup>

We went within 3 miles of  
Manchester where there  
was some fighting done  
of which we were in  
hearing of. marched <sup>to</sup> Stone

Sunday 14<sup>th</sup>

We lay over the greater part of  
the day and marched all night

Monday 15<sup>th</sup>

At the break of day we went  
into a general engagement  
which lasted about 1 hour.

Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup>

We lay over till 3 O'clock and then started to Maryland.

Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup>

We marched till 2 O'clock and then took up camp.

Thursday 18<sup>th</sup>

We marched through Shepherds town and crossed the Potomac into Ma.

Friday 19<sup>th</sup>

We staid in camp all day.

Saturday 20<sup>th</sup>

We marched through Sharpsburg and put up camp on the old battle

field and staid there till <sup>23<sup>d</sup></sup> Tuesday morning then we

started to Pennsylvania

Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup>

We entered into Penn. and  
marched through Winchester &  
Muncersburg and across the N. mts.

Thursday 25<sup>th</sup>

We lay over all day & night

Friday 26<sup>th</sup>

We marched all day & night  
through Loudentown & St.  
Thomas.

Saturday 27<sup>th</sup>

We marched through Chas.  
-bersburg & Shippenburg

Sunday 28<sup>th</sup>

We marched a short distance  
and took up camp near a  
big spring & within 22  
miles of Harrisburg

Monday 29<sup>th</sup>

or  
He turned back about 1 P.M.

Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup>

We marched through Shippensburg

or  
Wednesday July 1<sup>st</sup>

Then marched through Fayetteville,  
Salisbury to Gettysburg which  
was the battlefield. We lay in  
a line of battle that night.

Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup>

We lay in line of battle all  
day and about night we went  
into a general engagement  
& I was wounded about one  
hour in the night.

Friday 3<sup>rd</sup>

I got to the hospital about  
1 1/2 miles from Gettysburg where  
I staid until Monday morning

Monday July 5<sup>th</sup> 1863.

then from there I walked to  
Gettysburg & went into the Hosp.  
there where I staid until.

Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> then I left Penn.  
College at Gettysburg & at 5  
O'clock P.M. I took the train  
for Baltimore & arrived there

the next morning I staid in  
the car till late in the evening  
then marched down to the Hosp.

and from there that night I  
started to N.Y. I went through

Wilmington Del. about 10 O'clock  
and got <sup>to</sup> Phila. about 12 " &

that evening crossed the River  
in a Steamer over into N Jersey

& staid there in the car until  
next morning which was the 15<sup>th</sup>

we then crossed back over the  
River into Phila. again and  
in the evening of the 15<sup>th</sup> we  
went to a Hosp. in Phila. where  
we got dinner & staid till  
next morning which was the  
16<sup>th</sup> then we left the Hosp. &  
took a S. boat about 10 o'clock  
to N. N. and arrived there  
next day about 12 or 1 o'clock  
we then went up the Hudson  
River 22 miles to David's  
Island where we went into  
a hospital on Friday July 17<sup>th</sup>.  
and left David's Island  
on Saturday Sept 5 1863  
From Saturday night till  
Monday morning we

were out of sight of land  
Monday morning about 10  
O'clock we got to Fortres  
Munroe and the evening of  
the same day we reached  
City Point & lay upon  
the boat until the day 12  
O'clock then we took  
the train to Petersburg  
& at the F. Ground stop  
that evening about 4  
O'clock.

We received a few laughs  
at 10<sup>th</sup> at Petersburg  
and started home that  
night at 9 O'clock and  
to Williamsburg the next  
evening about 6 O'clock.

The battle of The Wilder-  
ness commenced Thursday  
May, the 5<sup>th</sup> day, 1861 about  
12 o'clock the 3<sup>rd</sup> U.S. Regt.  
was engaged and was occasi-  
onally engaged from then  
the balance of the day.  
It made 2 charges and then  
fell back and commenced  
entrenching where it staid  
Thursday night, Friday & Friday  
night and also Saturday eve-  
ning <sup>until</sup> about dark, then we  
left there and marched  
down our line of breast-  
works to the right a  
few miles and lay in  
an old field until

sunday morning; then we  
started and marched ~~on~~  
all day and stopped about  
night and threw up  
breastworks and there we  
staid all day Monday &  
Monday night; Tuesday we  
moved to the right and  
threw up more breastwor<sup>ks</sup>  
and that evening we made  
a change and ran the <sup>guns</sup>  
out of our breastwork then  
went back to our old  
position where we staid  
the balance of the night  
and also next day which  
was Wednesday that  
night we moved more

a few hundred yards  
into the woods and staid  
next morning which was  
thursday we went back  
to our breastworks and  
was taken as prisoners  
and marched out to the  
rear of the enemy, about  
three miles where we staid until  
friday morning then we started  
and marched to <sup>Bell Plains</sup> ~~Acadia~~ Creek  
(which was about 20 miles)  
where we staid until tuesday  
about 12 O'clock then we  
went on board the boat  
and staid until wednesday  
morning about day then  
we started to Point

Look Out Md. and got there  
Wednesday May the 18<sup>th</sup> day 1864  
and was marched into the  
prison about dark the same  
day where I staid until  
Sunday morning July the  
24<sup>th</sup> day; then I went out  
of that pen and left the  
Pen by Steam Boat the  
next night about 9 O'clock  
for Camp Elmira N.Y.

Wednesday the 27<sup>th</sup> the  
boat arrived at Jersey  
City about 12 O'clock and  
we left there by Cars about  
1 1/2 O'clock and we arrived  
at Elmira Thursday  
morning the 28<sup>th</sup> of July  
1864 1864

Released from prison  
June 16<sup>th</sup> day / 805 on Friday  
Left Elmira Friday evening  
at 6 O'clock arrived at  
Williamsport Saturday  
morning about daylight  
Sunday morning between  
midnight & day we past  
Harrisburg we arrived at  
Baltimore about 9 O'clock on  
Sunday morning & lay over  
at a boarding house until  
Wednesday evening (the 21<sup>st</sup>)  
then I was taken by a lady  
to the Infirmary where  
I staid until Saturday  
evening July the 1<sup>st</sup> I then  
started from Baltimore

and arrived at City Point  
the next evening about  
2 O'clock. I lay over there  
till next morning; from  
there I went to P. T. G. &  
strait out to Burksville  
I arrived there about 12  
O'clock and left there about  
4 O'clock. I got to Danville  
that night (Monday) about  
12 O'clock & left there  
next morning (Tuesday)  
about 6 O'clock & I got  
to Greensboro about 9  
O'clock & left there about  
4 O'clock. I got to Raleigh  
about 11 O'clock P.M. &  
left there next day (Wednesday)

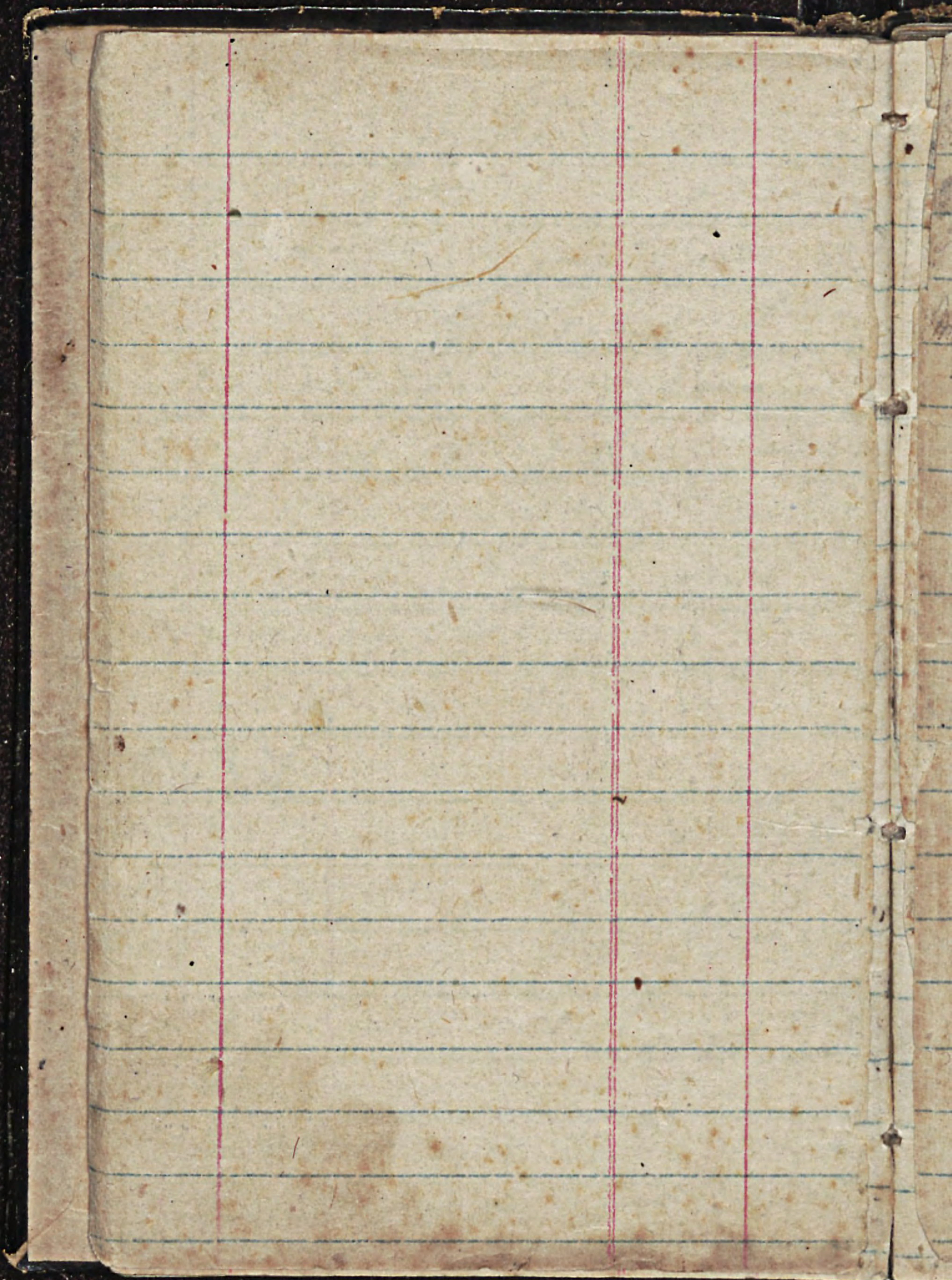

& got down to Bangor  
about about 9 O'clock  
that night which was  
wednesday night the  
5<sup>th</sup> day of July 1865
