

CHANCRE (Syphilitic, and not to be confounded with Chan-
croid).

190—R Hydrarg. chlorid. mit., . . . gr. xv.
Liq. calcis, ℥ij. —M.
Sig.: Shake and apply as a wash. (*Black Wash.*)

191—R Hydrarg. chlorid. corrosiv., . . . gr. j.
Liq. calcis, ℥viiij.—M.
Sig.: Shake and apply on lint. (*Yellow Wash.*)
JAS. L. LITTLE.

192—R Hydrarg. chlorid. mit., ℥ss.
Sig.: Dust on and cover with dry lint.
VAN BUREN and KEYES.

193—R Iodoformi,
Lycopodii, āā ℥iij.—M.
Sig.: Dust on and cover with dry lint. STURGIS.

CHANCROID (sometimes incorrectly called Chancre).

194—R Acidi nitrici, ℥ss.
Sig.: After cleaning the surface, apply with a match
or glass rod, exposing the surface until nearly dry or
painless; then dry the surface and reapply acid in same
way. Dry-lint dressing. VAN BUREN and KEYES.

195—R Acidi sulphurici,
Pulv. carbonis ligni, āā q. s. ut ft. magma.
Sig.: Dry the sore and apply evenly with wooden
spatula. Leave to separate. RICORD.

196—R Iodoformi, ℥ij.
Sig.: Dust on sore and cover with lint dipped in
glycerin. RINGER.

197—R Bismuthi subiodidi, ℥iv.
Sig.: Dust on sore and use dry dressings. (*Odorless,
antiseptic, and does not produce toxic symptoms.*)
CHASSAIGNAC, *Annual Univ. Med. Sci.*

198—R Pulv. acidi salicylici, ℥ij.
Sig.: Dust on sore and cover with dry dressing.
ANGLADA, *Annual Univ. Med. Sci.*
