Lanolini,
Ungt. belladonnæ, āā ℥ss.—M.

Ft. unguentum

Sig.: Apply to the abdomen. (*For tympany occurring in chronic Bright's disease, and due to peritoneal congestion.*)

908—R Potassii acetatis, ℥ss.
Infusi digitalis, ℥vj.—M.

Sig.: One teaspoonful every fourth hour to a child five years old. Used with the following:—

909—R Resinæ podophylli, gr. j.
Sacchari albi, ℥j.—M.

In pulv. no. viii-xii div.

Sig.: Take one powder. Repeat if necessary. (*To produce catharsis.*)
