

**SKIN DISEASES (Continued).**

1354—R Acidi arseniosi, . . . . . gr. x-xxx.  
 Adipis, . . . . . ℥j. —M.

Ft. ungt.

Sig.: Over a patch of skin three or four inches square, rub the ointment in well once daily for a fortnight. Then treat a fresh portion. (*In lepra.*)

TILBURY FOX.

1355—R Olei anacardii (cashew-nut), . ℥iv.

Sig.: Soap-and-water baths are used twice daily, followed by frictions over the whole body with cocoonut oil or olive oil. After the oil has remained on for three or four hours, the body is thoroughly cleansed by a soap-and-water bath. Then the oil of cashew-nut is applied on a sponge to a small portion of the skin, as large as the hand. A week or ten days later another application of cashew-nut oil may be made. If any herpetic or other eruption is present, then use the following:—

 Iodinii, . . . . . q.s. ad ft. sat. sol.

Liq. sodæ caust., . . . . . ad excess.

Olei olivæ, . . . . . ℥xxiv.—M.

Ft. linimentum.

Sig.: Use locally on herpetic or other eruptions that occur. Shake well before using. If there be a squamous or scurfy condition of the skin, then use the following:—

1357—R Vitelli ovi, . . . . . no. ij.  
 Balsami copaibæ, . . . . . ℥ivss.—M.

Ft. emulsio et adde—

Olei olivæ, . . . . . Oj.—M.

Ft. linimentum—

Sig.: To be used instead of the oil-baths, when the skin is scurfy. For the feet, hot baths (100° F.) of cocoonut oil are used twice daily. (*In lepra.*)

BEAUPERTHUY.

1358—R Hydrargyri chloridi corros., . . . . . gr. ii-iiss.  
 Infusi calumbæ, . . . . . ℥v. —M.

Sig.: A teaspoonful twice daily. Fresh meat and fresh vegetable diet, with good hygienic surroundings, are essential to success. (*In lepra.*)
