MESSAGE TO CHRISTIANS.

Bishop Cheshire Speaks True Words Touching Christians.

Dear Brethren:

At this happy Christmas season, may I not put aside the things which unhappily divide us, and with all respect, love and christian humanity, speak from my heart to yours?

Next Friday is Christmas Day. In times past some good people have scrupled to recognize this day as our Lord's birthday. But, leaving out all questions with reference to the particular day of Christ's birth and Bethlem, all our people do recognize Christmas as bringing to mind that blessed and fundamental fact of christianity, the coming to us of Him who is our Lord and our Saviour.

The word which I would speak to all my christian brethren, first, to those who recognize me as over them in the Lord, and then, with equal earnestness, but with greater respect and humility, to those who do not, if they will allow me the privilege of thus addressing them, is this:

Shall Christmas Day be sanctified by the word of God, and by prayer and praise, addressed to Him in His house, by His people of all names and of every kind, or shall it be wholly given up to merely secular and social festivity?

Our people will all keep Christmas in some fashion. Ought not christian people to keep it as christians? Shall we not, first of all, keep the feast to Him whose love provides the means of joy? And should not all forms of organized christianity seek for God's blessing upon the day, by endeavoring to teach all people to make the day holy by public worship?

Christmas is a fact in our social life; do we not need to make it a fact in our religious life?

I do not then address you, my dear brethren, with any other feelings than of sincere respect and affection in our common Lord, to whom I trust we are

all seeking to draw nearer at this season. I do feel that I am in a special sense the representative in this community of that branch of Christ's church here on earth, which especially values these holy seasons, and part of whose good work has been to perpetuate and to popularize them in the life of the American people.

We all long and pray for christian unity; may we not take a step towards it by uniting in such an effort to sanctify Christmas day in the life of our people?

Praying God's blessings upon you, my dear brethren, and upon all our people, and asking your christian charity for what I have thus presumed to say, I am, your servant in Christ Jesus our common Lord and Saviour.
