Length of Exercises.

[Essay read by Miss Nellie Buys before the Pitt County Teachers' Association:]

Every teacher, before opening school, should have some general plan in his mind of what he intends to accomplish. In every enterprise there is a great advantage to be derived from forethought, and perhaps nowhere is the advantage greater than in the business of teaching.

In order to aid me in forming a plan for myself, I subjoin a scheme of a day's duties adapted to my school of the simplest grades. My school consists of over forty scholars and upon inquiry I found that I could make four or five divisions or classes. The first I designated (A) class. The first division which consists of the more advanced children, unite in studying grammar, history, arithmetic, reading, spelling etc. The second (B) class pursue reading, writing, spelling, geography etc., the (C) class about the same work as the (B) class, the children being younger though. The (D) class consisting of smaller pupils, attend to reading, writing, spelling, and mental arithmetic.

It is very desirable that as much time should be devoted to recitations as can be afforded. It is seen that in certain studies as geography, mental arithmetic and spelling, we can attend to fifteen at once as well as seven. Sometimes after becoming better acquainted with our work, we can unite two of these divisions. All can be taught writing and drawing at once, in this way receiving undivided attention for the time. Besides, it is necessary to reserve some little time for exchange of exercises and also for interruptions which must necessarily occur. The recesses must be provided for, and sometime may be needed for investigation of violations of duty and for the punishment of offenders.

All this variety of work will occur in every school, even the smallest. Now if the teacher does not arrange this in accordance with some plan, he will be very much perplexed, even in a small school, and how much more in a large one! He will do well to consider very carefully the relative importance of each exercise to be attended to and then to write out a program or a scheme and place some where so that the children may see it.

It must not be forgotten that studying is also to be provided for, and that it is just as important that the pupils should be regular in this as in recitation.

The circumstances of schools will be found to vary so widely, that no model, however perfect in itself, would answer for all. Each one must exercise his own ingenuity and judgement to meet his or her wants. The recitations of the smallest pupils should be short and frequent, as the power of continuous attention, in the case of such pupils, is weak, the maximum time of recitation should not exceed fifteen minutes, and as they can be instructed only during the class recitation, not yet having learned the use of books, they should be called up as frequently as the teachers time will permit.

*The exercises that require the greatest stress of mental effort should come in the earlier part of the day. The working power of the mind is at its best from nine till twelve, and so a subject like arithmetic should come by preference in the forenoon, while penmanship, drawing, etc, might come later in the day.

Provide alterations that afford rest or an agreeable change. To pass from an exercise in reasoning to another where memory is chief

ly involved, is an agreeable change for a new mode of mental activity is called into play, while the one just employed has a period of rest.

We should have as few classes as possible. By securing a uniformity of books, by conducting some recitations by topic, by uniting two classes in the same study and by reducing the number of recitations in some subjects to two or three a week, it is quite possible to relieve an over charged program.

In every school consisting of pupils of different ages and circumstances, there will be more or less interruption to the general order and employment of the school. Some of the pupils have never been trained to system at home, perhaps most of them have been positively taught to disregard it at school. At any rate, it must needs be, in this particular, "that offences come." Nor should the teacher lose his patience though he should be often disturbed by the thoughtlessness of his pupils. He should expect it as a matter of course, and exercise his ingenuity as far as possible to prevent it. It may well be one of the sources of enjoyment to witness an improvement in the habits of his pupils in regard to system.

It should be one of the mottoes of every teacher, "A time for everything and everything in its time". In the construction of the plan or program for the day's duties, great care should be taken to provide for all these little things. If whispering is to be allowed at all in school, let it come into one of the intervals between recitations. If assistance in getting lessons is to be asked and rendered, let it be done at a time assigned for the special purpose. As far as possible, except in extreme cases, let the discipline be attended to at a time of general exercises, or some other period assigned to it, so that there shall not be any mixture of punishments and instruction during the progress of a class exercises.

Prosperous Pitt Countians in Norfolk.

The annual meeting of the stockholders of the Winston-Whichard Company, wholesale jobbers and importers of dry goods and notions, was held yesterday afternoon at the office of the company, 76 to 84 Commerce street in this city. A cash dividend of 10 per cent. was also declared. The stock dividend was paid in cash out of the surplus earnings of the company, leaving a surplus on hand.

A decision was reached at the company's meeting to subscribe to the stock of the Jamestown Exposition Company. The Winston Whichard Company has had a most successful career since its formation in this city and is one of the prosperous and progressive young business houses in Norfolk.—Norfolk Dispatch, 16th.

Silence of 50 Years is Broken.

Astonishment was the first feeling caused by the recent receipt of a letter from William Henry Tee, an uncle of Mrs. Georgianna Grimes, of this city. Mr. Tee had been considered dead for over 50 years, but he wrote from McLean, Australia, to say that he is well and has prospered and retired from business.

Mr. Tee was born at Portsmouth, Va., and is 72 years old. He is a son of George C. Tee, who was an officer in the revenue department of the naval service. Henry Tee left Portsmouth on the whaling vessel Antelope in 1852. A few months afterward intelligence came that the ship had been wrecked off the coast of Australia. Before that the vessel had touched at Sydney, New South Wales, and a letter that Tee wrote then was the last that was heard from him until the receipt of the letter to his brother, John C. Tee, who lives at Portsmouth. The letter stated that Mr. Tee had succeeded in a business way, had a large family and that he expected to visit his old home in the near future. No reason for the long silence was given.

Six brothers and sisters of Mr. Tee survive and live in Virginia. The youngest of these is a Mrs. Roberts, of Portsmouth, Va., who is 65 years of age. Years after young Tee's disappearance the property that fell to his brothers and sisters and in which he had a legal share, was divided. When questioned about this part of the story yesterday Mrs. Grimes said she did not know the sum that might have fallen to Mr. Tee, though it amounted to several thousand dollars. The question of a property division, or any claim to property on the part of Mr. Tee, will hardly be raised at this late date; though the result of such a contention would be very interesting.—Charlotte Observer.
