DAN HUGH McLEAN'S SPEECH.

A large crowd heard Hon. Dan Hugh McLean in the court house, Monday night, and his speech fairly bubbled with old time Democracy that brought frequent applause. After an introduction by ex-Senator F. G. James, Mr. McLean spoke for an hour and crowded much sound logic in that time. He empannelled his audience as a jury before whom he tried the issues of the two parties, and leave it to their judgment to decide whether the Republican party of misrule should remain in charge of the affairs of government, or the Democratic party with a clean, honest record take its place.

He took Roosevelt's record as a first witness, and forcibly showed how he did not occupy his high position by the will of the people but was a creature of circumstance. He referred to the president's vilification of Southern chivalry in scathing terms and said he did not see how even a self-respecting Republican of the South could support him. Any who should vote for him would be endorsing his denouncing as traitors the heroes of the Confederacy.

In State matters Mr. McLean rehearsed the records of both parties and over against the corruption and misappropriation that blackened Republican rule, he placed the clean, honest, prosperous administration of the Democratic party, and pointed his hearers to the facts.

The speaker gave independentism some severe raps. He said the man who went into a Democratic convention seeking a nomination, and because he failed to get it announced himself an independent and tried to defeat the party, was no better than a Republican, in fact was a Republican at heart. He urged that every Democrat stand by the principles of the party, that if any objections existed to laws that had been enacted let these be remedied within the ranks of the party and not try to do so by going to the camp of the enemy.

He wanted on the close of election day to hear the good news that old Pitt county had been true to herself and rolled up fifteen hundred majority for the Democratic ticket.

Monday's papers contained the letter of acceptance of Henry G. Davis as the candidate for the vice presidency on the Democratic ticket. Mr. Davis' letter is much the shortest of any of the expressions of the other candidates preceding him, but it is full of meat and to the point. As a running mate of Judge Parker he is a strong man, and every passing day gives a brighter forecast of the election of the Democratic ticket.

Sunday's Raleigh News and Observer was a hummer. It was a Democratic paper right.

There are no treasures in this stained world more pure, more sweet, more precious, more valuable, than those found in the hallowed vaults of a woman's ministry and a woman's love; for they are the richest gifts that God ever lent to earth to show man in their raptures the ecstasies of the higher and purer and nobler birth. —Raleigh Times

Every man has a personal right to choose his own political party. He has a right to belong to any party he wishes, or to be independent, or to belong to no party, if he desires. But there are some things he does not have a just right to do, though they are sometimes done. He does not have a right to be a candidate, receive votes from a party, and then simply because he does not get a majority of his party's votes and is not nominated bolt his party and repudiate it and work against the people who composed the convention of which he was a part. Such a course shows bad faith and is not morally right. Such a course proves a man untrue to the friends who supported him and is unworthy of a true man. And still less has a man the right to go over to the enemy because his friends are not nominated. When any man enters a convention and votes or affiliates with it he impliedly pledges himself to stand by its work and its nominees.—Oxford Ledger.

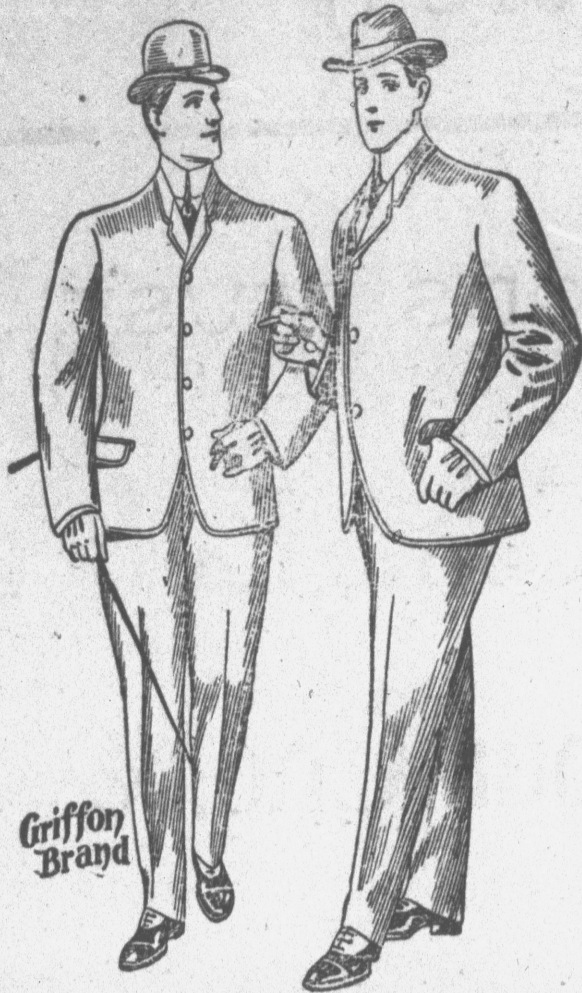

Dispensary Profits.

The total sales of the Greenville dispensary for the month of September was \$3,743.76 and the net profit \$1,252.40 This average for a year will give the county school fund \$7,514.40 the county share of the profits. When Greenville had bar rooms they paid a tax of \$2,200 that went to the county, so that it will be seen that a net gain of \$5,314.10 is added to the county by the dispensary.

At the same time you only have to look about you on the streets of Greenville to see that there is not near the drunkenness here since the dispensary was established as existed when the town had eleven bar rooms.
