ROOSEVELT SWEEPS THE COUNTRY.

CARRIES EVERY DOUBTFUL STATE AND GETS LARGE MAJORITY OF ELECTORAL VOTE.

NORTH CAROLINA DEMOCRATIC BY 60,000 AND ELECTS EVERY CONGRESSMAN. PITT COUNTY DOES GLORIOUSLY.

NEW YORK.

The New York Sun says at 7:30 that everything indicates Roosevelt carries New York by enormous plurality, exceeding McKinley's in 1900. Looks like a Republican landslide.

New York—Brooklyn Eagle, a Democratic news paper announces at 7 p m that Roosevelt has been elected president of U. S. and that Higgins been elected Governor of New York State.

The New York Journal says Boston Herald and Globe concedes election of Douglass, Democrat, for governor.

New York World concedes the election of a Republican House of Representatives with a probable majority of from 25 to 30.

The New York World concedes Roosevelt a plurality of 250,000 in New York State; a plurality for Higgins of 110,000.

New York Journal says returns indicate the election of Higgins, Republican, governor by at least 60,000.

776 districts of 3,024 outside of New York city gives Higgins 17,760, Herrick 17,633. Same 1900, Odell 14,538, Coler 11,879.

New York—It is conceded at Democratic National headquarters that Roosevelt has carried every doubtful state in the country.

New York—The Herald has flashed election of Higgins and Roosevelt.

704 districts out of 4024 in New York State; outside of city, Roosevelt 177,259, Parker 115,480. Same in 1900, McKinley 161,315, Bryan 119,828.

The New York Journal has sent a message of congratulations to Roosevelt.

Judge Parker sent this message to President Roosevelt: "Esopus, N. Y., Nov. 8th, 8:30 p. m. To the President, Washington, D. C. The people, by their votes, have emphatically approved your administration and I congratulate you. Alton B. Parker."

President Roosevelt's reply to Judge Parker's telegram was as follows: "I thank you for your congratulations."

At 9:15 p. m., Chairman Cortel you said that the indications are that the country has given an overwhelming vote of confidence in the President and his administration.

Associated Press Bulletin, Washington, D. C., Nov. 8.—President Roosevelt, tonight after the election returns clearly indicated the result issued the following statement: "I am deeply sensible of the honor done me by the American people in thus expressing their confidence in what I have done and have tried to do. I appreciate to the fullest the solemn responsibility their confidence imposes upon me and I shall do all that in my power lies not to forfeit it. On the 4th of March, next, I shall have served three and a half years and this three and a half years constitutes my first term. The wise custom which limits the President to two terms regards the substance and not the form. Under no circumstances will I be a candidate for or accept another nomination."

ILLINOIS.

Chicago—78 precincts give Roosevelt 11,513, Parker 5,044 returns from the first ward which has been strongly Democratic heretofore indicates that Roosevelt has carried it by 250

Chicago—It is estimated by experts on the first 100 precincts of the vote in Chicago, says that Roosevelt will carry city by over 50,000. Debs, the Socialist candidate for president, has polled a large vote in Chicago. Estimates on first 100 precincts indicate total of 45,000.

Chicago—Mayor Harrison says it looks like a landslide for Roosevelt, but we have hopes for the county ticket.

Chicago—500 precincts out of 1,562 give Roosevelt 76,562, Parker 36,546.

MAINE.

Ten cities and towns in Maine give Roosevelt 4141, Parker 1722. Same cities in 1900 gave McKinley 1700 Bryan 2682, a net Republican gain of 1202 votes.

NEW HAMPSHIRE.

Concord.—52 towns and ward-out of 292 gives Roosevelt 6,763, Parker 4,449

VERMONT.

White River—108 cities and towns out of 243, Roosevelt 31,451, Parker 7,631. Same 1900 McK. 32,987, Bryan 6,894.

MASSACHUSETTS.

Boston—Secretary Reuben Rush of the Democratic State committee, claims the election of Douglass by 20,000, while conceding Roosevelt and Fairbanks 7000 plurality.

Boston.—The Globe at 8:30 o'clock tonight says Douglass, Democrat, elected governor by a plurality of 25,000. Roosevelt carried the State by 8,000.

RHODE ISLAND.

Providence—Roosevelt carries the state by about 15,000.

CONNECTICUT

The Herald says Roosevelt's Connecticut majority will probably exceed McKinley's which was 28,000 in 1900.

New York Journal says New Haven, Conn., Republicans claim Connecticut by 25,000. Journal says returns Roosevelt carries Illinois, New Jersey and Wisconsin. Roosevelt's plurality in these states is disputed by the Democrats.

75 towns in Connecticut. Roosevelt 6017, Parker 3176, net gain Democrats 225

PENNSYLVANIA.

Philadelphia—U. S. Senator Penrose, Republican State chairman, says, "My advices from all parts of the State indicates a majority of 325,000. We claim it will be equalled if not exceeded. It is a great victory for prosperity."

NEW JERSEY.

Trenton—Scattering returns show consistent republican gains and indicate that Roosevelt has carried state by a large plurality.

MICHIGAN.

Detroit—Weather fair, heavy vote, returns slow.

Detroit—Republican State Central Committee at 8:30 o'clock announced that returns from the State indicate that Roosevelt's majority would be from 25 to 35,000

All the same we gave the Republicans the worst scare they have had in a long time.

A local candidate for legislature said he was in the hands of the people. Wonder what he thinks the people have done with him.

The Black Jack kid is a very fine kid, as the voters largely say; To Raleigh he goes, While King, full of woes, Is left at home to stay.

THE REFLECTOR while rejoicing over the splendid Democratic victory in the county and state, must confess a disappointment over the result in the nation. We had hoped it would be different, yet there was a belief that which ever way it went it would be with a landslide. The landslide came, but it was for the Republicans. Judge Parker has conducted a brilliant campaign, and though defeated he will ever occupy a high place in the hearts of the people.

The election returns show that there was a landslide for Roosevelt. He not only carried every Republican state, but every doubtful state as well went for him, leaving Parker not much but the solid South. It was seen early that he was elected by a large majority of the electoral college.

In the state the result is more gratifying to the Democrats. R. B. Glenn and the entire ticket is elected by a large majority, and it is probable that every Democratic congressman has been elected.

Old Pitt county has covered herself in glory, the majorities for the different candidates running anywhere from fifteen hundred to two thousand.

OHIO

60 precincts in Hamilton county Ohio gives Roosevelt 13,925, Parker 4062. Same in 1900 Republican 12071, Democratic 3964.

INDIANA

280 voting precincts outside Marion county gives Roosevelt 23,030, Parker 22,582.

KENTUCKY

Louisville—The Courier Journal estimates the state will go Democratic by about 10,000.

WEST VIRGINIA

Parkersburg—Without a precinct in the State counted enough has been learned to indicate the Democratic ticket has made heavy gains.

IOWA

Des Moines—Chairman of State Central Committee claims state by 130,000 to 150,000. Des Moines Register and Leader says: "If present ratio per precinct keeps up Roosevelt will have about 140,000 plurality."

NORTH DAKOTA

Grand Fork—State returns very slow so far a normal vote indicated 25,000 majority for Roosevelt.

SOUTH DAKOTA

Sioux Falls—Senator Kelridge claims Roosevelt carried South Dakota by 40,000.

CALIFORNIA

San Francisco—At 6:00 p. m. no figures were received from this city or state. Reports from various counties indicate Roosevelt's majority to be 30,000.

COLORADO

Denver.—D. B. Fairley, Republican chairman, says, "Roosevelt has certainly carried State, and Governor Peabody is safe though his vote will fall short of Roosevelt's."

MINNESOTA

St. Paul—Steele county complete gives Roosevelt 1,850, Parker 1,100

MISSOURI

Kansas City—The Republicans claim the election of Shartel, Republican to congress in the 16th district, hitherto strongly Democratic.

NEBRASKA

Meager returns received up to 7:45 p. m. show good gains for Roosevelt, but indicates republican loss on governor. Only five precincts have thus far reported, however they may not be indicative of the general result.

UTAH

Salt Lake City—The heaviest vote ever polled is reported with much scratching. At Democratic state headquarters it is conceded Roosevelt has carried the state by 8,000 plurality.

WASHINGTON

Owing to great length of ticket, in State ticket will be close, but State is safe for Roosevelt.

MARYLAND

Baltimore—Charles County majority of 600 for Roosevelt and Sydney Mudd for congress. Republican loss of 500 over 1000.

Baltimore—The Evening News claims that Parker has carried the city by 20,000 majority. Forty precincts of 319 gives Parker 4571, Roosevelt 4673, a net gain of 1123 over 1900 for Democrats.

VIRGINIA

Virginia elects nine members of congress out of a total of ten districts. The result in the 9th district is in doubt with the chances in favor of Schlemp, republican.

Richmond—The Times-Dispatch estimates Parker's plurality in the state from 20 to 25,000 and says republicans elect their nominee for congress in the 9th district. All other districts Democratic, vote light.

NORTH CAROLINA

Raleigh.—Indications are a heavy vote was polled. Returns from the first, second, fourth and fifth congressional districts show a Democratic landslide.

Entire Democratic State ticket elected by 60,000 to 75,000 majority. Every congressional district Democratic.

SOUTH CAROLINA

Columbia—Parker has carried South Carolina by not less than 40,000 plurality. Democratic State ticket has been elected without opposition. The State legislature is unanimously Democratic.

GEORGIA

Watson ran behind predicted vote. Democratic majority about 45,000.

FLORIDA

The few scattering returns so far indicate usual Democratic majority.
