When the officers were in about 40 yards of the house the boy appeared in the door with a gun and called to them to stop. They did not stop and the boy raised the gun and fired, a load of bird shot striking Constable Galloway in the shoulder, side of the head and face. The officer's wound was painful but not serious. The negro boy made his escape.
