**The Wrong Conception.**

The Reidsville correspondence of the Charlotte Observer says: Col. Upton B. Gwynn, of this county, is very much interested in the movement to erect a monument to the memory of young Theodore Estes. In an interview he said to The Observer's correspondent:

"I see that the women of Nelson county, Va., are intent on the consummation of a noble act the erection of a monument to the memory of Theodore Estes, who was slain by Judge Lovins, as a testimonial of their confidence in the innocence of young Estes of the crime for which he was shot. There could be no more emphatic rebuke to a hasty resort of the 'unwritten law' instigated by a criminally false statement, not only to shed innocent blood, but, strange to say, to shield at the same time the life of the murderer by such perjured testimony. There is no such record extant where women have come to the rescue of a man's reputation charged with wronging one of their own sex—proving beyond doubt that Estes' reputation was perjured away by a woman, but it took the same sex to vindicate his character and wipe out the false impression the court record may transmit to posterity."

This is all wrong. The spirit is good, but it is carrying the thing too far. "The unwritten law," "brainstorm" and "emotional insanity" are dangerous, dangerous indeed, and unless suppressed will work disastrously in our courts of justice. Since these pleas of defense have come to light they have caused many flagrant miscarriages of justice.

But to keep the death of young Estes and the crime he was alleged to have committed in the minds of the people is calculated more to produce "so-called brain-storm" than to suppress it.

Young Estes, perhaps, died an innocent man, it is hoped he did and the affair is much regretted, but a monument as high as the skies cannot bring the young man back to life, nor can it punish the man who deliberately (if such be the case) murdered him. The fair name of the women of our Southland and the chastity of the home is dearer to every Southron than life itself, but it can be preserved in better ways.

In the rush of things we forgot it, but the Durham Herald comes to remind us. The Herald says:

"While giving credit to Governor Glenn and Judge Long the News and Observer should not be forgotten. It has all along been the champion of cheaper rates and was the first to suggest that the superior court take action against those who violated the rate law, regardless of the stand taken by the federal courts."

The News and Observer also "sits at the head of the table."

The Wadesboro Messenger-Intelligencer has a half-column editorial along the line of suggestion to Governor Glenn and Solicitor Robinson that the cases against the Anson county men charged with the lynching of the

man Johnson be dropped. But those gentlemen will hear such an appeal with deaf ears. Let those men, prominent citizens or what not, receive the penalty of the law, or else prove their innocence. But Johnson didn't lynch himself.

**FOR THE LITTLE ONES.**

**Sheep and Wolf is a Lively Game For Out of Doors.**

Tear a piece of paper into as many pieces as there are players, and on each piece write some number representing an hour of the day. As there are only twelve hours there can be only twelve numbers, but if more than twelve are playing you can make some of the numbers half hours until there is the required amount.

On one piece mark a cross and then shake all the numbers in a hat, each player drawing one out. The one who gets the slip with the cross on it is "it," or the "wolf," while the others players are called sheep.

**The Quince Blossom.**

The beauty of the apple blossom has been sung by the yard and for ages, but the quince blossom has in some way failed to inspire the poets, though it is a lovely flower, at first a cone of five closely wrapped pink petals that gradually unclose till there is a globe slightly opened at the top, showing the yellow anthers within. The petals keep one deep pink edge, the rest getting paler till the opposite side is almost white. Finally the flower opens into a flat, delicately tinted cup, with the pistils holding up the group of yellow anthers on mauve pink stems. The glossy green quince leaf, with its white satin underfinish, fits well with the flowers.

**QUEER OLD CUSTOMS.**

Guernsey Island is a Place Where Things Are Different.

In Harper's Robert Shackleton writes of the curious romances, old time customs and unique conditions in Guernsey, one of the Channel Islands.

"I found that in everything Guernsey is the place that is different. Men are of age at twenty; the weekly half holiday is on Thursday; the gallon is 3 per cent smaller than the English; to reduce English pounds of weight to Guernsey pounds one must multiply by twenty-nine and divide by thirty-two, and one is given thirteen Guernsey pennies for every English shilling.

"Is it tax paying day or quarter day? Behold a long line of islanders with wagons and other islanders with panniers, for parts of rents and taxes are payable in wheat and corn, in butter and eggs and chickens and cels, and contracts calling for chickens are likely to specify the minimum length of 'queue'."

"Does a man wish to sell or devise his real estate? He is not a free agent. The eldest son has the right indefeasible to the house and to part of the land, and the other children have the right to the remainder. If there are no children and the man makes a deed of sale, it must be publicly announced, and any one of kin as near as the seventh degree may stop the transaction and purchase the land himself. One easily understands why land remains in the same families for generations.

"A man dies, leaving personal property. It is divided into as many shares, plus one, as there are children. The eldest son selects two shares, and the other children choose one each in order of age, the original division, to insure fairness, having been made by the youngest, who, perforce, takes the share that is finally left."

**Founder of Modern Geology.**
