FRENCH AND BRITISH IN ALLIANCE BUT NOT CHANNEL FISHERMEN

Paris —AP—Despite the reinforced Franco-British alliance there is still "undeclared war" between the inhabitants of the Isle of Jersey, part of King George's realm, and Saint Malo, a city of the French Republic.

Causes of the dispute are the Mingier islands, rocky, treeless dots just off the French coast inhabited up until 1938 only by gulls and a few wandering French and English fishermen.

The French government laid buoys, guiding fishermen to the islands from the mainland, but recently the Jersey authorities not only laid their own buoys, but erected several fishermen's shacks on the islands.

Saint Malo fishermen protested to Paris where the ministry of foreign affairs is at work on the case. Meanwhile fishermen are busy doing things to each other's buoys and shouting insults at one another when they meet.
