Dear Mother:

I am writing so many other letters this week I'll not have time for one home. We are busy as can be in the Language School and it is growing warmer every day. Summer clothes are very comfortable. The dress Olivera sent me, ~~the~~ hat frame arrived yesterday. I hope the sweater arrives soon. I also hope it doesn't have the same fate Olivera's did in my trunk.

A very swell funeral went by our house today with all kinds of animal figures to be destroyed. There, just over the wall last night was a terrible noise of celebrating a wedding. Of all dinns and noises, this is the worst. I hardly slept.

Last night at 8 P.M. I heard a lovely concert given by a Chinese orchestra, - foreign trained of course, and it was very splendidly done.

We all were thrilled. To think of this kind of music way out in China!

If you find an account of the recent China Synod do read it. It has been most interesting. A Chinese Bishop has been elected and approved of by the House of Bishops, but not yet consecrated. We are expecting it will be done very soon. This is of Chekiang diocese.
